Agenda Items #1, #2 and #3: <u>MEETING CALLED to ORDER, INVOCATION and PLEDGE of ALLEGIANCE</u>:

At 6:30 P.M., Chairman Giles E. Byrd called the October 03, 2016 Columbus County Board of Commissioners Regular Session Meeting to order. The invocation was delivered by Commissioner Amon E. McKenzie. Everyone in attendance stood and pledged Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America which was led by the Debs Softball Team.

Agenda Item #4: BOARD MINUTES APPROVAL:

Commissioner Russ made a motion to approve the September 19, 2016 Regular Session Board Meeting Minutes, with one (1) correction on Page 781 and one (1) correction on Page 782, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #6: <u>PUBLIC INPUT</u>:

Chairman Byrd opened the floor for Public Input. The following spoke.

- 1. **Franklin H. Thurman, 125 Maultsby Drive, Whiteville, NC 28472:** stated the following:
 - -I am here in support of a new building for Whiteville High School;
 - -The school needs to move to an adequate site where needs can be met;
 - -Renovating the existing site would be cumbersome;
 - -The heat and air conditioning at Whiteville High School is not adequate for the needs;
 - -In the case of an emergency, the entire campus cannot be locked down;
 - -Inadequate classrooms and facilities endanger future learning opportunities for colleges and universities;
 - -The lack of updated science and computer labs impact core subject programming that uplift the potential of a student being successful beyond Whiteville High School;
 - -In the engineering and architectural field, the basic foundation needs to be in high school and Whiteville High School does not have the ability to provide this;
 - -We need to improve the education and the athletic programs;
 - -We need to make the County and the City great; and
 - -Consider building a new school for Whiteville High School.

2. **Jack Hooks, Jr., 217 Fuller Street, Whiteville, NC 28472:** stated the following:

- -I concur with the statements made by Mr. Thurman;
- -It is time to go forward with Whiteville High School; and
- -The location of the school should not control the decision.

Agenda Item #5: PRESENTATION - RESOLUTION of APPRECIATION and RECOGNITION to COLUMBUS COUNTY DEBS:

The Resolution of Appreciation and Recognition to Columbus County Debs was presented to the softball team. This document was approved and adopted at the September 06, 2016 Board Meeting, and the contents of this document may be viewed in the September 06, 2016 Board Meeting Minutes.

Agenda Item #7: MONARCH MENTAL HEALTH - REQUEST for PUBLIC HEARING:

Laurie Weaver, Senior Director of Philanthropy, requested the Board to establish October 17, 2016, at 6:30 P.M., as the date and time for a Public Hearing for the 5310 Grant.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to establish October 17, 2016, at 6:30 P.M., as the date and time for a Public Hearing for the 5310 Grant, seconded by Vice Chairman McDowell. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #8: SCHOOLS - COLUMBUS COUNTY SCHOOLS:

Kelly Jones delivered the following presentation on the addition of Educational Cable Access Channel operated by Columbus County Schools.

- 1. Cable companies have franchise agreements with the state that allow them to use public right-of-ways in exchanges for making some concessions.
- 2. One of those concessions is public, educational and government access (PEG).
- 3. Columbus County currently has one (1), operated by Southeastern Community College.
- 4. If the channel is operated for ninety (90) days, we are entitled to a payout from the Supplemental PEG Fund. Please note that this does not reduce Columbus County's video tax revenue or SCC's existing Educable revenue. These are additional funds.
- 5. Currently, this is just over \$25,000.
- 6. Last year, CCCA produced 75 hours of original programming. CCCA students and teacher would be responsible for channel, providing real-world experience for students.
- 7. By law, the local government is the only entity that can request an additional PEG channel. Columbus County Schools is asking for the commission to do so, and name CCS as the operator.
- 8. By statute, if the Commissioners request an additional PEG channel, then the cable companies (TWC/Charter and ATMC) must provide it, free of charge.
- 9. Video will be broadcast from the CCS Central Office and Old Dock Elementary. (TWC/Charter and Atlantic) CCCA will operate the channels remotely.
- 10. CCS has the equipment in place to broadcast on the channel. We just need an interconnection to the cable companies. Funding in future years will allow us to purchase additional equipment.
- 11. Columbus County Schools believe that this is an excellent opportunity to showcase our schools and the work that our broadcasting students are producing. The channel will be available for viewing online for those who are not cable subscribers.

Commissioner Bullard made a motion to approve the request for the additional Cable Access Channel, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #9: <u>ADMINISTRATION - NORTH CAROLINA STATE HEALTH PLAN</u> for TEACHERS and STATE EMPLOYEES TRANSITION:

Mark Browder, with Mark III Insurance Services, provided the following information regarding the transition from our current health plan to the State Health Plan.

- 1. The State Health Plan has tentatively accepted Columbus County into the Plan.
- 2. The effective date for the transition will be January 01, 2017.
- 3. Only active employees will be accepted.
- 4. Retirees would have to be transitioned to individual plans and funded by the County.
- 5. There are significant reasons to transition to the State Health Plan:
 - -Future stability;
 - -Significantly lower cost for the County;
 - -Over a \$1,000,000 savings;
 - -Significantly lower cost for the employees; and

\$ 662,068

- -15% to 55% Reduction in cost.
- 6. The challenges are:
 - -Retirees moved off of the plan, to individual plans is a change, which makes them uneasy;
 - -There haven't been any claims challenges to date;
 - -The County has multiple payments to make for retirees;
 - -Once the Health Reimbursement Accounts are established, the payment process has gone smoothly; **and**
 - -No guarantee that BCBSNC will remain in the individual market. It is possible that the County will have to cover the retirees through a different method in the future.
- 7. The State Health Plan consists of three (3) plans which each employee will decide which plan they want to participate in as follows:
 - A. 80/20 Plan;
 - B. 70/30 Plan; and
 - C. CDHP Plan.
- 8. Items moving forward:
 - -waiting on the MOU to be returned by the State;
 - -January through June of 2017, the MIT will continue to bill the County. The MIT will not expect payment.
 - -Enrollment Dates the expected enrollment dates will be in December for a January 01, 2017 effective date.
