# Quorum was present.

Public Hearing called to order at 6:10pm. Dr. Thomas Kirby welcomed all board members and visitors. Kimberly L. Smith read the "Public Hearing Rules." Dr. Thomas Kirby informed the public that comments will be held to 3 minutes, the secretary would time each speaker. The floor was then open for public comments. A total of (6) individuals made brief comments on the proposed "Regulations Governing the Location of Home Burial Sites, Church and Family Cemeteries in Columbus County." After a brief discussion, the regulations will be revised in Section 102 and Section 103.

#### II. Welcome/Invocation

#### III. Approval of Agenda

# IV. Public Comment

### V. Approval of Minutes

VI. Quality Improvement	Martha Faulk stated the following:  A. Work Force Development Policy Review (Benchmark 37, Activity 37.6, Benchmark 26, Activity 26.1) "Locum Tenens Coverage for staffing" was added as last resource for recruitment of staff to page 3. Motion to accept the addition was made by Dr. Nicole Martin seconded by Dr. Daryl Diefes and carried by the board.  B. Staff Development Plan (Benchmark 26, activity 26.1, Benchmark 37, Activity 37.6) "Staff Skills Competency Check Off List" along with their annual performance evaluation was added to assist the employee with meeting their workplace needs and goals for growth, lateral position changes or a step down if the employee so chooses. VII. Nursing	by the board.  Hilda Memory stated the following:  A. BOH Training Child Health  (Benchmark 36, Activity 36.3)  Columbus County infant mortality rate has dropped  We provide vaccines and well child check-ups  2014 vaccination rate for Columbus County Health Department is 97%-overall the county average is 62% and the state at 86%.  Total of 5072 vaccines were given in 2015  Total of 872 lead tests were given in 2015
	B. Zika Virus Update (Benchmark 40, Activity 40.1) CDC recommended testing for a pregnant woman with history of travel to an area with ongoing Zika virus transmission. The major mode of transmission is through the bite of an infected mosquito. There are limited reports of sexual transmission and blood transfusion. Zika can be found in blood, semen, urine and saliva. So far, we have tested 2 patients that have traveled to Mexico-we have to get permission from the State before we can test.
VIII. Social Work	Tammie Robinson gave the following:  A. BOH Training Care Coordination for Children

	(Benchmark 36, Activity 36.3) Care Coordination for Children (CC4C) is a program offered at no charge for children from birth to 5 years of age who:  ✓ Have long term medical conditions ✓ Are referred by the child's doctor ✓ Are dealing with challenging levels of stress From Nov15, 2015-Feb 15, 2016 we saw 192 patients of which we had 825 assessments, 1530 service coordination and made 50 home visits.
IX. Environmental Health	Kristie Priest stated the following:  A. Methamphetamine Lab (Benchmark 18, activity 18.2)  As a result of the Meth Lab discovered at Lake Waccamaw on December 30, 2015, the Health Department hosted a methamphetamine informational session with partnering agencies at Southeastern Community College on March 9, 2016. This session was offered to the public. The session involved Stephen Worthington with the Sheriff's Office, Melinda Lane with Social Services Department, Kellie Farrel with the State Bureau of Investigation. Certain agencies were not clear on their responsibilities. Kristie gave an overview of the Methamphetamine Decontamination Laws and Rules enforced by Environmental Health. The Health Department is in charge of overseeing cleanup of the meth labs. The property owner is responsible for the cost and actual cleanup.
X. Health Education/Promotion	A. Community Health Assessment (Benchmark 1, Activity 1.3, Benchmark 1, Activity 1.1)  ✓ In 2016, we found that the biggest health issues or concerns are: chronic diseases (cancer, diabetes, heart disease, stroke) followed by substance abuse and obesity  ✓ Obesity was a close second to substance abuse  ✓ Our county is described as persistently poor by the USDA  ✓ The past six years (2009-2015) Columbus County ranked 100 (last) in the state for being the most unhealthiest county  ✓ There is a lack of physical activity, eating healthier foods and smoking among adults as reported in the 2015 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey. These three health behaviors are self-supported among Columbus County residents and negatively

impact the health of residents.

✓ The #1 leading cause of death in Columbus County: heart disease

Sarah asked members to review health assessment with intentions of voting to accept in April 2016. One change may be made to the health assessment and we are awaiting NCDHH's decision to date the document for 2015 or leave it as is.

### ✓ Teen Pregnancy Prevention-

Making Proud Choices is being implemented by Jamika Lynch, Teen Pregnancy Prevention Coordinator at Flemington Academy, First Baptist Church in Chadbourn, and Columbus County Dream Center. The Chadbourn Police Department and Chadbourn youth that are participating in the teen pregnancy prevention program, along with Chadbourn community members participated in a joint training session to explore how Chadbourn Police Department and Chadbourn youth can work together to decrease substance abuse.

Chadbourn PD was given approximately \$12,000 of our NCCI/Wake Forest grant monies to help them with patrol within certain neighborhoods in Chadbourn.
