

Cross Roads be designated as County Highway No. 5. It was also ordered that a road maintenance force be put on that road on February 1, 1929. McRay Fowler was ordered as foreman of the new road project. When he takes charge of this road force, L. E. Jones is to be placed in charge of the Tabor and Fireway Road.

Ordered: by the Commissioners: That the road leading from Lees Lake to Hallsboro be taken over to be maintained by the road force now operating on the New Britton Road under the charge of B. A. Marlowe.

An order affecting each of the above named projects was made by the Commissioners granting each foreman two men besides himself, thus making a total of three men at any time working on any road project in the County. The Board discussed the feasibility of assigning to each member of the Board of Commissioners some road project or department in the County to be placed under his supervision, the discussion resulting in the following orders:

That the Tabor and Fireway road, the Tabor and Fair Bluff road, and the Chain Gang and Tractor force be supervised by D. F. McGougan.

That the road leading from Bladen County line by Chadbourn to Tabor be supervised by J. R. Blake.

That the New Britton road, the Fireway and Whiteville road, and the County Garage be supervised by H. G. Avant.

That the County Home and the cultivation of its farm be supervised by J. C. Hooks, Sr.

It was also ordered: that D. W. Merritt investigate the condition of the road which the Chain Gang has just built through Ransom Township. He is to make recommendations concerning this road to the Board.

On motion the meeting was adjourned.
