September 2, 1929, to re-assemble in an adjourned meeting which was held Monday, September 30, 1929. All members of the Board were present. The meeting was called to order at 10 o'clock in compliance with law for the purpose of hearing any protest that might be made by any taxpayer of the County relative to a school building bond issue to which publication was given ten days prior to the date of this meeting. As no taxpayer appeared before the Board to enter protest against the issuance of school building bonds in the amount of \$40,900.00, the Board of County Commissioners went on record as adopting unanimously the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

Whereas, this meeting having been called pursuant to the provisions of the County Finance Act, c.81 P.L. 1927, and a resolution of this Board duly adopted on **13th** September 1929 for the purpose of hearing any citizen or taxpayer who might wish to protest against the issuance of the \$40,000 of School Building Bonds of Columbus County ordered by this Board on **13th** September 1929, said order having been published as required by law, and no protest being made and no citizens or taxpayers appearing before the Board for the purpose of prptesting, the said order as introduced at the meeting of this Board **13th** September 1929, and as published in the News-Reporter, a newspaper published in the Town of Whiteville in said County, was read and finally passed by the following roll-call vote, to-wit: D. F. McGougan, aye; J. R. Blake, aye; J. C. Hooks, Sr., aye; D. W. Merritt, aye; H. G. Avant, aye; voting no, none; and the same was ordered published in accordance with the provisions of the said County Finance Act, and

WHEREAS, it being necessary for the establishment and maintenance of a six months term of public schools in said County required by the Constitution of North Carolina, the said schools being a part of the State system of public schools, to erect schoolhouses in said County as follows: at Chadbourn, a schoolhouse to cost \$32,000; at Evergreen, two-room addition to schoolhouse to cost \$4,000, and at Hallsboro, two-room addition to schoolhouse to cost \$4,000, a total of \$40,000, the construction of the said buildings to be of the type defined in s.ll sub.s.hl of the County Finance Act, and to issue bonds therefor, in this respect the County being an administrative unit of the State,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina,

Section 1. That the bonds so ordered shall be dated 1st. November 1929 and shall mature and become payable as follows: \$2000 thereof on 1st. November in each of the years 1932 to 1951 both inclusive; denomination \$1000, and shall be 40 in number, numbered from 1 to 40 both numbers inclusive, and shall bear interest from their date at a rate to be determined on the date of sale, not exceeding six (6%) per centum per annum payable semi-annually on May 1 and November 1 in each year in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the Central Hanover Bank & Trust

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Company in New York City.

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Section 2. That a tax shall be levied and collected on all the taxable property in said County sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds as and when the same shall become due and payable.

Section 3. That the said bonds shall be sold on sealed bids in the Courthouse at Whiteville by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County on with November, 1929, at 12 o'clock noon and that advertisement of the sale thereof as required by the County Finance Act be published in the News-Reporter, a newspaper published in the Town of Whiteville in said County; the News-and Observer, a newspaper published in the City of Raleigh, North Carolina, and in the Daily Bond News, a financial journal published in the City of New York, and the said newspapers are hereby found and determined as proper papers in which to advertise the sale of the said bonds.

Section 4. That the said bonds and coupons attached thereto shall be submtantially in the form following:

This bond may be registered as to principal by the holder in his name on the books in the office of the Clerk to the official Board, and such registration shall be noted on back of this bond, after which no valid transfer of this bond shall be made except on said books until after registered transfer to bearer.
