The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in the Commissioners' office at the Courthouse in regular monthly session on Monday, January 6, 1930. Members of the Board present were:

The minutes of the meetings held by the Board during the month of December, 1929, were read and approved, after which the following orders were passed:

Mrs. M. S. Dunn appeared before the Board of Commissioners in regard to a refund which had been granted by an order of the Board on the first Monday in December, 1929, for 50% of the value of a mortgage held by her against N. Kramer. After the granting of the refund in December, but before same was submitted to the Tax Collector as part payment on Mrs. Dunn's taxes, it was learned that an error had been made in granting the refund to Mrs. Dunn in that the law regarding the releasing of a mortgage holder on one-half of the mortgage value applies only to cases in which the mortgage is made to cover houses constituting a home or buildings constituting the premises of a home. Since the property covered by Mrs. Dunn's mortgage is a place of business, the order granting the refund was rescinded. There is to be, therefore, no refund made to Mrs. Dunn on the property in question.

B. H. Brown of Bolton appeared before the Board in regard to the County's releasing two school vouchers, one of which was made payable to his wife, Mrs. Gertrude Brown, at the Bank of Whiteville in the amount of \$105.00, the other was payable to C. Cannon at the Bank of Whiteville in the amount of \$110.00. Mr. Brown's contention was that these vouchers had been intercepted in the mails between Bolton and Whiteville and that said vouchers had been cashed either through forgery or false pretense by a person or persons other than either Mrs. Brown or C. Cannon. In order that

said H. B. Brown might take the vouchers for identification to the stores at which they were cashed, a motion was made by D. W. Merritt, seconded by I. R. Blake, motion being carried, that the County Auditor release said two vouchers to the said H. B. Brown and that he give the County a receipt for each of said vouchers.

Perry Floyd appeared before the Board on this date in regard to a road which needed to be reconstructed near his place. On account of said road being a township project, the County Commissioners referred the said Perry Floyd to the Tatum Township Board of Commissioners for relief in

rebuilding said road.

A delegation of citizens and land owners at Lake Waccamaw appeared before the Board in regard to getting the Chain Gang to construct a road bed along the cast shore of Lake Waccamaw. This delegation desired that the Chain Gang be sent to Lake Waccamaw not later than April or May. The Commissioners, however, did not make a definite promise as to whether the Chain Gang would be available by that time for the proposed project.

At the same time the delegation represented by Mr. K. B. Council submitted a resolution to the Board for adoption. The following is the reading of the resolution: "Ordered by the Board of County Commissioners in regular session this 6th day of January, 1930, that the State Highway Commission be requested to furnish engineering assistance on the State road project from Highway No. 20 to the shore of Waccamaw Lake, and on County project along the Lake shore and from Lake shore back to Highway No. 20 at Lake Waccamaw station."

The foregoing resolution was unanimously adopted by the Board. A copy of said resolution is to be filed with Hon. W. A. McGirt, State Highway Commissioner for the third District, and a copy with Hon. R. A. Doughton, Chairman of State Highway Commission.

Ordered: That a refund voucher in the amount of \$2.00 be issued to M. L. Marlowe on the General County Fund for poll tax charged against him in Bug Hill Township for the year 1928. Said M. L. Marlowe is refunded on account of being sixty-five years old.

Ordered: That the bill for one coffin in the amount of \$25.00 as presented by T. C. Applewhite in the burial of A. Lee Collum be paid.

The guards at the Chain Gang asked the County Commissioners for an increase in their salaries. The Commissioners discussed the matter but finally ordered no salary increase to be made at this time.

A delegation of citizens from Williams Township came before the Board

in regard to keeping the Chain Gang in Williams Township three or four months longer during which time the Chain Gang would build a road beginning at or near the Stewart place on Highway 23 to the Chadbourn and Tabor road, a distance of approximately five miles. After hearing the proposal made by the delegation, it was ordered that the Board of Commissioners set a day, the day named being Friday, January 10, to go down to the Stewart place and there meet the people of Williams Township who were interested in the proposed project for the purpose of deciding as to the location of the road.

The foregoing motion as placed by H. G. Avant and seconded by J. R. Blake was carried by the following vote: For vuilding the road--J. R. Blake, H. G. Avant, D. F. McGougan. Against building the road--D. W. Merritt, J. C. Hooks, Sr.

J. Carr Williamson asked the Board of Commissioners for a reduction in the valuation of property in Tatum Township. The Commissioners took no action on the matter at this time, however, but asked Mr. Williamson to come before the Board on the 3rd Monday in June, at which time an adjustment would be considered.

It was ordered by the Board of Commissioners: That the offer of \$205,000.00 made to the State Highway Commission regarding the paving of Highway 23 from the Bladen County line near Clarkton via Whiteville and Tabor to the South Carolina line be withdrawn. The resolution relative to this offer as passed by the Board on November 5, 1929, is hereby rescinded. Hon. W. A. McGirt, 3rd District State Highway Commissioner, is to be notified of the action of this Board.

C. C. Russ, County Superintendent, came before the Board in regard to a proposed \$60,000.00 bond issue for the erection of two school buildings in

Columbus County during this fiscal year. After hearing Mr. Russ, the County Commissioners ordered that application be filed immediately with the State Sinking Fund Commission for the purpose of obtaining authority to issue bonds in the amount of \$60,000.00

The financial condition of the General School fund was brought to the attention of the Commissioners, whereupon the Board passed the following resolution:

Be it ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that two notes be executed in the **aggregate** amount of \$50,000.00 to be in denominations of \$25,000.00 each, dated January 16, 1930, maturing ninety and one hundred and twenty days after date, and bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum payable at maturity, both principal and interest payable to BEARER at North Carolina Bank & Trust Company of the City of Wilmington, North Carolina, in anticipation of 1929 taxes; that said notes be sold or hypothecated and the proceeds thereof turned into the General Fund of said County of Columbus;

Be it further resolved that the full faith and credit of the County of Columbus be pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest of said notes at maturity.

Mr. Martin, district representative of the Sinclair Refining Company, submitted a special bulk-purchase contract for oils and greases which the said Sinclair Refining Company was desirous of making with the County. The contract stipulated a reduced price per pound or gallon for all grease and oil products purchased under said contract. The contract was signed by D. F. McGougan, Chairman, in evidence of the acceptance by the Board of the terms embodied therein and a copy of same is on file in the Commissioners' office.

There being no further business to be transacted at this time the Board voted that adjournment was in order until 3:00 p.m. on Friday, down my January 10, 1930.

According to adjournment on Tuesday, January 7, 1930, the Board of Commissioners met a delegation of citizens of Williams Township at the Stewart place on Friday, January 10, 1930, at 3:00 p.m. All members of the Board were present for the meeting.

The purpose of going to the Stewart place was to meet a delegation of citizens there regarding the location of a proposed road beginning at or near the Stewart place and leading to the Chadbourn and Tabor road near Hughes! Mill. A request was made of the County Commissioners to allow the Chain Gang to remain in Williams Township for approximately four months longer in order that the aforesaid road might be constructed. The matter as to the location of the road was left entirely to the judgment of the Board of Commissioners. After discussing the proposition at length the Board of Commissioners ordered that said proposed road be built, at the same time it being distinctly understood that the Chain Gang shall not remain on said project later than June 1, 1930. Ip the proposed road has not been completed by that date the Chain Gang is to be moved to other parts of the County and Williams Township Road Board is to complete the building of the project. It was then proposed that the road be built via Dock Hinson's place to a point at or near Hughes' mill, from which a place Williams Township Road Board is to complete the project to the Chadbourn and Tabor highway. The Board also ordered at this time that H. C. Edwards, Superintendent of Chain Cang, survey the right-of-way for the proposed road in order to see which would be the shortest and most practical course to follow.

After leaving the Stewart place, the Board returned to the Commissioners' office for the purpose of hearing Dr. J. C. and Hon. J. R. Williamson relative to effecting a settlement on back taxes now due the County on this property. Dr. Williamson asked the Board to place a flat valuation of \$5.00 per acre on the lands known as the Carolina Strawberry Farms Company containing approximately 9212 acres having yearly valuation of \$62,371.00 in 1924-25-26, the valuation in 1927 being reduced to \$46,060.00. The members of the Board held, however, that they had no authority to adjust a matter of this nature relative to the payment of back taxes. It was, therefore, ordered that the County Attorney consult the Attorney General for an opinion as to the power of the Board of

Commissioners in adjusting at this time the valuation of back years for which taxes were due.

The Board of Commissioners discussed at this meeting the matter of transferring part of the County funds from the Bank of Whiteville to the Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company. After the subject had been discussed fully, D. W. Merritt made a motion, which was seconded by H. G. Avant, to transfer from the Bank of Whiteville to the Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company the account which carries the road funds of the fifteen townships. A vote on the foregoing motion was carried according to the following vote: For the transfer--D. W. Merritt, H. G. Avant, J. R. Blake, Against the transfer--D. F. McGougan, Not voting: J. C. Hooks, Sr.

After the vote was taken and the motion was carried it was further ordered that the transfer be made as of February 15, 1930, and that the Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company be required to submit to the Board for acceptance, securities in the form of United States, Liberty, or North Carolina State Bonds in the amount of \$10,000.00 which the County shall hold as a depository bond of said Bank.

Ordered: That W. J. Tate be paid \$50.00 for rent of his lathe used at the County Garage during the year 1929.

The Board having no further business to transact at this time, adjournment was voted in order until Thursday, January 16, 1930.

According to adjournment, the Board of Commissioners met at the Stewart place on Thursday, January 16, 1930, at 1:30 p.m. all members being present, . for the purpose of deciding which route should be followed in the construction of the proposed project leading from State Highway 23 via Dock Hinson's place and Hughes' Mill to the Chadbourn and Tabor Highway.

H. C. Edwards had made three surveys for right-of-way, these being submitted to the Board of Commissioners. One of the surveys called for a course beginning at the Stewart place on Highway 23 and ending at the Peacock road about 75 yards west of Dave Hughes' place. The second survey began approximately
