The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in the Commissioners' office at the Courthouse on Monday, June 2, 1930. Members of the Board present were:

After the reading and approval of the minutes covering meetings held during the month of May, the following business was transacted:

It was discussed by the Board as to whether there should be more than one day assigned to the hearing of tax complaints. The Board finally ordered, however, that, in accordance with an Act of the 1929 Legislature, meeting would be held on the third Monday in June, the date being June 16 this year, for the purpose of hearing all taxpayers who desire to make complaint regarding taxes, valuations, or irregularities. It was further ordered that the Board would meet again on Tuesday, June 17, if after Monday, June 16, it did not feel that the work of adjusting taxes had been sufficiently completed.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund D. M. Newman in Chadbourn Township for the year 1929 on \$ valuation, said refund being granted to cover the tax on the 12-acre Batchelor tract of land which has been double listed.

Ordered: That the following taxpayers, living in Welches Creek Township and in Burney School District, but charged in Bogue No. 1 White School District, be refunded on Special School tax for the year 1929 on account of their claims of not being legally obligated to pay Special School tax in Bogue No. 1.School District:

H. P. Creech, \$5.21; J. S. Creech, \$4.63; Miss O. J. Creech, \$3.25; Miss S. N. Creech, \$2.13; Victoria Creech, \$2.75.

Ordered: That the land in Williams Township originally owned by C. V. Ward be sold under tax sale foreclosure to D. F. Ward in consideration of the payment of \$10.00.

Ordered: That J. W. Ward be given \$2.00 for each of two children, \$4.00 being the amount of woucher, as present relief.

Ordered: That the hospital bill of Estelle Gibson of Bladenboro, N. C., be deferred until July 1, 1930, for further consideration.

Ordered: That Charlie Stewart be allowed \$5.00 as present relief.

Ordered: That if a special term of Court is to be held in Columbus County, the Commissioners will leave the matter of recommending to the Governor for such term to the Judge and Solicitor of this District, rather than for the Commissioners to make such recommendation at this time. The foregoing order was passed after the reading of a letter addressed to the Board of County Commissioners from Solicitor Woodus Kellum, who urged that the Board should take action as recommending such a special term.

Mrs. Agnes Barnhardt made her report to the County Commissioners, the following orders being passed in regard to persons whom she discussed with the Board:

It was ordered that -- Letsey Miller, Colored, be admitted to the County Home.

That the \$15.00 allowance of Hick Pate's family be cut to \$10.00 during the summer months.

That a bill of \$6.86 be paid to M. L. Hill by General County voucher for expenses of Miss Laura Raspberry.

That Champ Ward be admitted to the County Home.

That Miss Harriett Holmes not be allowed any financial relief from the County on account of her having several brothers who are able to take care of her.

Ordered: That the one mile of road between Bert Harrelson's filling station and Vann Hinson's place be added to the mileage now being maintained by G. C. White's road force.

Ordered: That J. R. Blake be appointed a committee of one to investigate the cost of fixing road across berry patches which were left during the time the Chain Gang was building the road by W. H. Beck's place and that of Gus Hinson. It is further ordered that said J. R. Blake is hereby authorized and empowered to make whatever contract he may deem advisable in building the road across the places which were left untouched at the time of constructing the road leading from Highway 23 to the Chadbourn and Tabor Highway.

Ordered: That D. F. McGougan be authorized to investigate the cost of repairing road at J. G. Duncan's, also of repairing sand bed and cleaning ditch at or near Henry Stanley's place and that he shall make whatever contract in regard to both projects he deems necessary.

Ordered: That the following land sale certificates now in the hands of J. D. Lewis, County Attorney, for foreclosure and investigation be cancelled:
