

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners held its regular monthly session in the Commissioners' office at the Courthouse on Monday, July 7, 1930. Members of the Board present were:

After the reading and approval of the minutes covering meetings held during June, the Board transacted the following business:

Ordered: That J. W. Ward of Whiteville, N. C., Star Route, be given \$3.00 per month for the support of two children, first payment to begin as of the date of this order.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund J. Winslow Hinson of Whiteville Township for the year 1929 on \$1,000.00 valuation, refund being allowed on account of error which was made by the list-taker in raising valuation when transferring the original valuation from the Bank of Whiteville to the above named listing.

Ordered: That the repair bill on the County automobile operated by Miss Cleveland be paid in the amount of \$106.60 to Pridgen and McGougan, Whiteville, N. C.

A motion made by H. G. Avant, seconded by J. R. Blake, was carried that the hospital bill of Mrs. A. E. Spivey in the amount of \$76.00 be paid to Thompson Memorial Hospital.

Ordered: That the legal representatives of the First National Bank in Florence, the Royster Fertilizer Company, and the Bank of Columbus be notified that the Board is considering the withdrawal of its offer of settling on a basis of a \$12,000.00 minimum amount regarding the Williamson tax matter on account of the long delay in taking the matter before the Court. It was agreed upon by the County Commissioners and the counsel for the firms above mentioned that the matter would be taken before the Court in order to see if the County would receive the full amount of the tax or would settle on a minimum basis of \$12,000.00. This agreement was conditioned upon the matter being referred to the Court for adjustment within thirty days from that date. Unless the matter is argued before the Court at an early date the Board of County Commissioners will be inclined to withdraw its offer.

Mrs. Agnes Barnhardt, County Welfare Officer, made her monthly report to the Board of Commissioners on this date. After discussing with Mrs. Barnhardt different persons whose names had been brought to their attention, the Commissioners passed the following orders:

That Nancy Jones, Della Carroll, and Catherine Stubbs be dropped from the Outdoor Poor list.

That Mrs. Melissa Evans be given \$2.00 as present relief.

That Miss Laura Raspberry be given \$2.00 as present relief.

That Martha Ward be admitted to the County Home and that her name be dropped from the Outdoor Poor list.

That W. G. Holmes be given \$5.00 per month.

That the name of Charlie Stewart be referred to Dr. Johnson for examination.

On first Monday in June an order was passed by the Board authorizing J. R. Blake, member of the Board, as a committee of one to let contract with some person for completing the road across strawberry patches left unfinished at the time the road was built by the Chain Gang from the Stewart place to the Chadbourn and Tabor Highway. Mr. Blake reported on this date that said contract had been let to G. C. Hinson in the amount of \$125.00 for completing said road.

An order was passed by the Board on the first Monday in June authorizing D. F. McGougan, Chairman, to contract with some one to ditch a road at J. G. Duncan's place, also to repair sand bed and clean ditch at or near Henry Stanley's place. Mr. McGougan reported on this date that contract in the amount of \$3.00 had been made with J. G. Duncan for ditching road by his place, and that the said D. F. McGougan is to continue his investigation of the road by Henry Stanley's and H. E. Long's.

It was ordered by the Board on the first Monday in June that D. F. McGougan and H. G. Avant be appointed a committee of two to deal with, or buy from, as they thought best, some road machinery company whatever road equipment they considered the County needed at the present time and the said committee report to the Board as to their action in the matter on the first Monday in July. On this date, therefore, H. G. Avant reported that the said committee had purchased three Galion standard road machines to be delivered at Whiteville, freight prepaid, at the price of \$735.00 each. Mr. Adams, the person from whose company the machines were purchased, agreed to send his mechanic to Whiteville to unload said road machines without any expense to the County. The machines are to be paid for under terms of net cash up to August 7, 1930, or by note after that date at 6% interest.

On account of a desire of the Board to re-district the mileage of roads now being maintained by the various County road forces it was ordered that

all of the members of the Board meet at Chadbourn on Wednesday, July 16, 1930, at 7:30 a. m. for the purpose of going over all County road projects and making whatever changes they deemed advisable. It is understood that at this time the road in Bug Hill Township as discussed by G. C. Cox before the Board on the first Monday in June and known more definitely as the Wild Cattle road, will be investigated as to its condition and what can be done in the way of repairing same.

Ordered: That J. M. McGougan, of Tabor, be refunded \$30.00 on schedule "B" tax, refund being granted on account of the Tax Collector over-charging him for electrician and radio licenses based on the population of the Town of Tabor.

Mr. Hammerle, of the State Forestry Department, came before the Board of Commissioners in behalf of getting the County to renew its budget appropriation of \$2,000.00 for forest protection for the year 1930-31. Since the expenditures against the \$2,000.00 appropriation for the year 1929-30 amounted to approximately \$1600.00, leaving approximately a \$400.00 balance, the County Commissioners ordered that a \$2,000.00 appropriation be included in the General County budget and that a tax rate be set sufficiently to raise the \$1600.00 required amount.

Ordered: That Mrs. Nancy Barnes of Tabor, N. C., be admitted to the County Home.

On the 16th of June when the Commissioners met in the Commissioners' office as a Board of Equalization for the purpose of hearing and adjusting tax matters, the Board increased the valuation on the property of several persons, setting the first Monday in July as the date to hear the protest of any person, whose valuation had been raised. E. K. Proctor, attorney, came before the Board in H. T. Dillon's behalf, stating that it was impossible for Mr. Dillon to be here on that date and asked that the Board set a later date for Mr. Dillon's appearance. The Board, therefore, ordered that a meeting would be held on Wednesday, July 23, 1930, at 9:00 a.m. for the purpose of hearing such tax complaints as had been deferred previously.

The matter of drawing a jury for the next term of Court was deferred until the above mentioned date of meeting.

The Board of Education discussed with the Board of County Commissioners the school budget for the year 1930-31. The matter was discussed at length, especially regarding the inclusion in the total budget of \$60,000.00 which was desired by the Board of Education for erecting school building in ^{Fireway} ~~Sugar~~ Berry district and one in the New Hope district. The County Commissioners refused to include that amount in the budget and took no action in regard to

approving the budget on this date. The Board of Commissioners suggested to the Board of Education that the approval of the budget should be deferred until the meeting on July 23. Before presenting said budget on that date the Board of Education was asked to revise their figures of estimated needs in such a way as to effect as much reduction as possible from the figures as presented on this date.
