

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in the Commissioners' office at the Courthouse on Monday, August 4, 1930, in regular session.

Members of the Board present were:

After reading the minutes of the meetings held during the month of July, same being approved, the Board transacted the following business:

Martin H. Schulken, local attorney, asked the Board to appropriate \$15.59 with which to buy clothes for John F. Ward, young Negro, who was sentenced to the Reformatory by the Judge of Juvenile Court. The Board ordered that an amount not exceeding that named above be appropriated, a voucher on General County fund be issued at whatever time the clothes are purchased.

A road project known as the Wild Cattle road has been discussed several times previously with the Board of County Commissioners. The matter was again discussed on the date of this meeting, after which a motion made by H. G. Avant, seconded by D. W. Merritt, was carried, that D. F. McGougan be appointed a committee of one to receive sealed bids for the construction of a fill and two bridges on said road. The said D. F. McGougan is to submit said bids at the next Board meeting, it being understood that the Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject any or all bids according to its discretion. The specifications of the road construction are to be as follows: Grading, approximately 160 yards; dam, to be 16 ft. on top; two bridges, each to be 10 ft. in length with a road width of 16 ft. and to be constructed of heart material; the fill is to be of a 2-ft. average.

D. M. Thompson came before the Board regarding a release on taxes for L. W. Stanley, of the Tabor vicinity. A motion made by J. R. Blake, seconded by H. G. Avant, was carried, that on account of his being a disabled World War Veteran, the said L. W. Stanley be relieved of paying any schedule "B" license tax for the sale of merchandise during the year 1930-31; it is further ordered that he be relieved of 1930 poll tax.

Mrs. Agnes Barnhardt made her monthly report to the Board of County Commissioners whereupon the following orders were passed:

That Mrs. W. J. Parker be admitted to the County Home.

That Asa Ward, c/o Mrs. Walter McKeithan, Bolton, N. C., be allowed \$5.00 per month, the date of the first payment to be as of the date of this order.

On the date of this meeting the following was ordered and spread upon the minutes:

"It is hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, that the form of contract between the said County and the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Company, by the provisions of which the said Railroad Company grants to the said County the right or license of constructing a public road crossing at grade across the right of way and main track of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad near Wananish, Columbus County, North Carolina, at a point 2145 feet eastwardly, measured along the center line of said track, from mile post 34 (Wilmington mileage), as particularly described in said contract dated July 31, 1930, and as shown on the blue print attached to said contract and made a part of same, be and the same is hereby approved."

"Further that the Chairman and Clerk of said Board of County Commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to execute said contract in the name and on behalf of said County."

"It is further ordered that when said crossing is opened for use, the old road crossing located 1545 feet eastwardly from the said Mile Post, be removed and abandoned."

The agreement follows:

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 31st day of July, 1930, by and between the ATLANTIC COAST LINE RAILROAD COMPANY, a corporation created and organized under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Virginia, hereinafter for convenience styled the Railroad Company, party of the first part, and COLUMBUS COUNTY, of the State of North Carolina, acting by and thru its Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter for convenience styled Licensee, party of the second part:

- W I T N E S S E T H -

That the Railroad Company, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to it in hand paid by Licensee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and of the covenants and agreements to be kept and performed by Licensee, as hereinafter expressed, hereby gives and grants to Licensee the right or license of constructing a public road crossing at grade across the right of way and main track of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad near Wananish, Columbus County, North Carolina, at a point 2145 feet eastwardly, measured along the center line of said track, from mile post 34 (Wilmington mileage), the said road to extend across said right of way in a northeasterly or southwesterly direction at an angle of approximately 71 degrees with said center line; as shown in red on blue print hereto attached and made a part hereof; said right of way being 130 feet wide, i.e., 65 feet wide on each side of said center line.

And Licensee hereby covenants and agrees in consideration of said license:

FIRST: That said crossing shall be constructed at the cost and expense of Licensee, but in a manner and of materials satisfactory to the Engineer Maintenance of Way of the Railroad Company.

SECOND: That Licensee, for and in consideration of the privileges and benefits granted by the Railroad Company, and benefits flowing therefrom unto the Licensee, agrees to save harmless the Railroad Company from any and all claims on account of personal injuries or damage to property of whatsoever nature arising during the construction of said crossing; and Licensee agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Railroad Company from any and all damages that might occur to said Railroad Company on account of improper or faulty drainage at said crossing due to the construction thereof.

THIRD: That Licensee will when said crossing is opened for use, abandon and remove at Licensee's expense and in manner satisfactory to the Railroad Company, the old road crossing located as shown in yellow on said attached blue print 1545 feet eastwardly from said mile post.

It is understood and agreed that this agreement shall not be binding until it has been ratified by a resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County, a copy of which resolution is attached hereto and made a part of this agreement.
