Ordered: That Jasper Bowen, Superintendent of County Home be directed to bury William Whitehead formerly of Sycamore, Georgia, at the expense of the County and the bill to be presented the County and the bill to be presented the proper Georgia authorities.

Ordered: To transfer a bid of \$41.91 to J. P. Waddell in the case of Columbus County against Mattie Miller and Lee Miller.

Ordered: That refund be issued on a valuation of \$580.00 to Arthur Baker Bordeaux, Bolton Township, which amount is 50% of the amount of mortgage on Real Estate due E. W. Fuhr.

Mr. Jackson Greer and Mr. W. H. Powell appeared before the Board in behalf of Mr. A. W. Baldwin asking that the salary of Auditor be put back to \$200.00 per month. Ordered, that the salary remain \$150.00 per month. Mr. Baldwin accepted the position of Auditor and his bond was fixed at \$10,000.00.

Ordered: That the Tabor and Pireway road and Tabor and Fair Bluff road with their tributaries be consolidated with Mr. McRay Fowler as foreman.

Mr. Fowler is to receive 75¢ per day above wages now received, effective Jan. 1, 1931.

It is further ordered that the board may at any time require an additional bond in its discretion.

It is further ordered by the Board that Farmers and Merchants Bank of Tabor, N. C., be designated and selected as depository for the Township Road Funds of Columbus County provided said bank furnished a bond in the sum of TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000.00) with some surety company authorized to do business in North Carolina, and/or North Carolina State Bonds, and/or United States Government Bonds as security for said county funds, and in the event State or Government Bonds are furnished, the same may be deposited with another bank which has been approved by the Corporation Commission as a Depository Bank, said bonds to be held for the benefit of the county and subject to the
