Motion by D. W. Merritt, seconded by R. C. Benton to move the Chain Gang not later than April 15, 1931, on the east side of White Marsh at a point about the line of Bogue and Waccamaw Township.

Ordered: That A. S. Sasser be sent to work under the supervision of B. A. Marlowe on the Silver-spoon Road.

On motion of Blake and second by Barrell that the Chairman be authorized to sign the following notes: \$10,000 for a balance due on February School expense and \$25,000 for March and renew two \$25,000 notes due March 22 and renew one \$25,000 note on March 30, also signing a note for Lees Township.

It is ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County in meeting assembled on the 5th day of March, 1931, that the foregoing note be and the same is approved in the sum of Nine Hundred (\$900.00) Dollars and the full faith and credit of Lees Township is pledged to the payment of said note at its maturity; that this note does not exceed seventy five per cent of the taxes levied for road purposes in Lees Township for the fiscal year 1930.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, adjournment was voted in order until March 23, 1931.
