WHEREAS, the said road is in bad condition, is only about twelve feet wide, is practically a one-way drive, and greatly in need of improvement;

Now, therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to improve said road by widening same and making other improvements which it needs; and

Be it further Resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to the State Highway Commission and a copy recorded on the minutes of this Board.

Whereas, the Doard of County Commissioners of Columbus County has been informed that the State Highway Commission proposes to pave State Highway # 23, extending South from Whiteville to the South Carolina line, in the near future.

And whereas, the said Board of County Commissioners has been informed that the State Highway Commission has caused to be laid out a road which it proposes to pave, other than the present Highway # 23; and

whereas, the laying out and paving of the entirely new road, or practically new road as proposed by the Highway Commission will work a hardship and inconvenience to quite a number of people, who are new living on Highway # 23; and

Whereas, there is fifty odd families on the new proposed route and seventy odd on the old route on the proposed Highway # 23 which the State Highway Commission proposes to pave; and

whereas, quite a number of permanent bridges have been built on the present Highway # 23 and the road has been widened and the road bed, in the opinion of this Board, is now in a condition to be paved;

Now, therefore, Be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County in a regular meeting assembled on this the 5th day of October, 1931, that the State Highway Commission be requested and urged to pave State Highway # 23 as it is now located and to abandon the proposed change as is the intention of said Highway Commission, according to the information of the Board of Commissioners.
