Whereas, on October 5, 1931, the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County passed a resolution requesting the State Highway Commission to pave the old road leading from Whiteville to Tabor rather than paving a new proposed road leading from Whiteville to Tabor as surveyed by State Highway Engineers and posted in the Columbus County court house; and

Whereas, it was not the intention of this Board to protest formally the locating of a new highway and subsequent paving thereof, but only to designate the old route as a preference to the new proposed route; and

Whereas, this Board does not desire to go on record as being opposed to the new route but only to show preference for the old route; and

Whereas, this Board desires to take no action that will hinder or delay the hard-surfacing of either route from Whiteville to Tabor.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to disregard the resolution passed on October 5, 1931, for all other purposes than showing the old route Number 23 a preference, for it is not the intention of this Board to file formal protest to the laying out and paving of the new route as surveyed by Highway Engineers.

Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent today to the North Carolina State Highway Commission and a copy recorded on the minutes of this Board.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, adjournment was voted in order until Monday, November 2, 1931.
