John W. Hall, Sheriff, tendered his bond in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars with Lloyds Insurance Company of America as sureties, approved, ACCEPTED AND ORDERED recorded, all Commissioners being present and voting therefor. This Bond is given to take place of Bond accepted on December 5, 1932, issued by the Union Indemnity Company as sureties who are now in the hands of Receivers.

Arthur W. Baldwin, Auditor, tendered his bond in the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars with the Fidelity and Causalty Company of N. Y. as sureties, approved, accepted and ordered recorded, all Commissioners being present and voting therefor.

Mrs. Mae Stanley Rooks tendered receipt from the Fidelity & Causalty Company of N. Y. for \$12.50 being premium on \$2500.00 Bond from January 5, 1933 to Jan. 5, 1934.

Whereas, certain citizens of Columbus County have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County to request the State Highway Commission to place upon the State Highway map as a Class "A" Road, the public road leading from Tabor, N. C., via Chadbourn to Bladenboro, N. C.; and

Whereas, the said citizens set out the fact that this is a much used road, over which a large part of the strawberry crop is handled;

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County: that the State Highway Commission be requested to take over and place on said State Highway map as a Class "A" road the said road leading from Tabor via Chadbourn to Bladenboro; and

Be It Further Resolved: that a copy of this resolution, together with the petition, be forwarded to the North Carolina State Highway Commission at Raleigh, a copy sent to Hon. James H. Clark, State Highway Commissioner, and a copy placed upon the minutes of this Board.

L E A S E

This lease, made and entered into this the 3rd day of January, 1933, by and between Columbus County, a municipal corporation of North Carolina, herein referred to as the lessor, and the State Highway Commission of North Carolina, and its successors herein referred to as lessee.

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars cash in hand paid to the lessor, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said lessor does hereby lease and grant to the lessee and its successors for a term of one year from the date above named with the privilege of renewal for a period of one year at the unit price of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per year with the right to go upon, use cultivate and grow crops of any and all kinds upon the following real property owned by the said lessor with rights of egress and ingress to and over same. The lands hereby leased are located in the state and county aforesaid and in Whiteville Township, being all that property lying and being on the East side of the road known as the Whiteville and Pine Log Road, except however, the building or buildings on said property which are now owned by the county and being occupied by tenants of the said county.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the lessee is not to cut and remove the timber on the above described premises.

It is mutually understood and expressly agreed that the consideration hereby recited includes full compensation for the rental of the above described tract of land.

In witness whereof, said party of the first part has caused these presents to be signed in its name by its chairman and its corporate seal to be signed in its name by its chairman and its corporate seal to be hereto affixed and attested by its Clerk, all by authority of its Board of Commissioners duly given, this the day and year first above written.

On motion of C. A. Small and second of W. L. Hobbs, it was ordered that the act of Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company be validated by this Board wherein the said Bank charged on January 31, 1933, the sum of \$7,960.45 to the County General School account, applying the same on Columbus County note for \$20,000.00 due February 1, 1933, due and payable to Bearer at Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company, and which note said Bank holds. The above amount charged to the school account represents the portion of the \$20,000 note credited to the school account on December 28, 1932. It is further ordered that said bank's act be validated by this Board wherein said Bank on January 28, 1933, charged to the General School account \$1125.00 interest due said bank on notes of the County for school purposes, amount covering interest on notes due January 19, 1933. This Board feels that because the Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company was the holder of the above-mentioned notes that said bank was within its right to charge to the school account these amounts for that the officials of the Board of Education refused to sign vouchers covering said amounts.

(Passed by Board 2-15-33)

On motion of R. C. Benton and second of C. A. Small, it was ordered that \$10,000 promised Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company on \$20,000 note due January 19, 1933, be paid; provided, however, that the Local Government Commission gives its approval of paying \$5,000 from the General County fund, which fund owes the School Fund some amount because of land sale certificates credited to the County General Fund, and provided said Commission approves paying \$5,000 from either the Court House Bond fund or the Special School fund. The Local Government Commission advised that paying out of the General County Fund \$5,000 met with its approval, but the payment from the Court House Bond or Special School Fund did not.
