ORDERED: That a horizontal reduction of 10 percent on real estate in Columbus County be made in accordance with the provisions of the 1933 Machinery Act, the said reduction to affect the valuations for the year 1933, and the years thereafter, until further change is made by Law or by the Board of County Commissioners according to Law. This order is made in accordance with Article 4 Section 1 of the 1933 Machinery Act, which gives said Board option of horizontal increase or reductions or general valuation.

Ordered: ^{HAT} That the County Attorney be directed to advertise the lands described in a judgement in the matter of "Columbus County vs. J.C.
