WHEREAS, The United States Congress has passed an act sponsored by President Roosevelt, authorizing the President to employ men for work in reforestation, flood control, prevention of soil erosion, plant pest and disease control, fire protection, and similiar work in the public domain, national or state, furnishing them with subsistence, clothing, medical attention and hospitalization, and cash allowance as may be necessary during the period they are^{so} employed,

WHEREAS, This Act was passed with the purpose of relieving unemployment and at the same time of conserving and adding to our long neglected forest resourses,

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Counties of North Carolina have natural forest areas of great value which in the past have been constantly ravaged by fire and forest pests, a condition that has been no less deplorable than impossible to cope, and

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Counties of North Carolina have numbers of unemployed in dire need of help, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Commissioners of Columbus County, here assembled, commend this reforestation program of the President and respectfully urge and request that the authorities directing this relief measure, give due consideration to the urgent need, in the County of Columbus and the surrounding counties, of both the protection of our forests and the welfare of our unemployed.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this Resolution be sent to Dr. Fred Morrison, Director of Relief Work at Raleigh, to Colonel J. W. Harrelson, Director of the State Department of Conservation

and Development at Raleigh, and to our Representatives in Congress at Washington.

WHEREAS, certain citizens of Bug Hill Township, Columbus County, have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners to request the State Highway Commission to do certain work on a road in Bug Hill Township fully described in the petition attached hereto:
