The following business was transacted.

Ordered: that Mrs. Leila Wayne be allowed \$10.00 present relief and \$10.00 per month, one-half of this amount to be paid from Mothers' Aid.

Ordered: that resolution passed July 26th, 1935 relative to postponing advertising 1934 land sale list, remain as was passed.

Ordered: that R. L. Davis be allowed to pay 1930 tax on real estate only plus 6% flat and \$3.00 Court Cost.

Ordered: that E. K. Pierce be allowed to pay 1930 and 1932 taxes plus 6% flat and \$3.00 Court Cost.

Ordered: that the partial payments now deposited in Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company in the name of Julian D. Lewis, County Attorney, be turned over to the County in full and that a record of same be kept in the office of the Board of County Commissioners as a permanent record; ordered further that taxpayers having enough money paid into said Julian D. Lewis to retire any certificate at par be allowed payment in full of such certificate at par and the certificate cleared. Ordered further, that when part payments are made to said attorney in the future that same shall be turned over monthly to the County in order that the money may not lie idle.

Ordered: that 1933 tax sale certificates now in the hands of R. J. Lamb, Tax Collector, be turned over to Julian D. Lewis, tax attorney, for collection or foreclosure under the same terms and conditions as certificates for prior years have been turned over.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, adjournment was voted in order until Monday, August 5th, 1935.
