Minutes of the last meeting being read and approved, the following business was transacted.

Ordered: that H. D. Tedder be allowed a refund order for 1934 taxes and also an exemption order from paying Poll Tax on account of his being a disabled world war veteran.

Ordered: that George Newman be admitted to County Home.

Ordered: that B. R. Patterson's 1934 taxes be separated so C. D. Patterson and others may pay their part of said taxes.

Ordered: that Columbus County Hospital be paid \$6.50 for treatment for J. W. Ward.

Ordered: that Bradley Nobles be allowed \$2.00 present relief.

Ordered: that Neil Barcroft be allowed \$2.00 present relief and his allowance be increased to \$6.00 per month.

Ordered: that Lizzie White be allowed a food order for \$2.00.

Ordered: that Jesse Byrd, Tabor City, Rt. 3 Box 18, be allowed \$3.00 present relief and \$3.00 per month.

Ordered: that R. B. Brewer be allowed a food order for \$2.00.

Ordered: that Lee Ward be allowed a food order for \$2.00.

Ordered: that D. P. Ward be given food order each month for \$2.00 in place of issuing voucher.

Ordered: that J. P. Maultsby, Whiteville, 1928 taxes be cancelled on account of Town of Whiteville taking part of lot for street and taxes for 1932 and 1933 having been paid with street valuation is reason for cancelling the 1928 taxes. It is further ordered that the valuation on lot be fixed at \$1,000.00 for 1931 - 1934, and 1935.

Ordered: that the State Highway Commission be requested to have a flash light device erected at rail road crossing in the Town of Evergreen on Route # 20.

Ordered: that J. W. Schwartz 11 acres in Waccamaw Township be reduced from \$ 1,601.00 to \$1,200.00.

Ordered: that I. C. Jordan and wife be granted release on 5 8/10 acres tract of land in Chadbourn Township which is included in mortgage to County.

Ordered: that News Reporter Company be given 60% and Columbus County News be given 40% of the County printing.

Ordered: that the County Board of Education be permitted to increase their 1935-1936 school budget in the sum of \$ 33,300.00 for debt service to be paid out of 1934 and prior years taxes. It is further ordered that the Chairman and Clerk sign said budget as submitted.

Ordered: that Davis Allen, Tabor City, be allowed \$4.00 per month.

Ordered: that K. Clyde Council, Wananish, be given a voucher for \$2.00 each month for food order for General McCoy.

Ordered: that Wesley Ward's allowance be increased to \$4.00 per month.
