RESOLUTION

Whereas, certain citizens of Columbus and Bladen Counties have petitioned the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of both Columbus and Bladen Counties to recommend the taking over and maintaining of a certain road by the State Highway Commission; and,

Whereas, said road is the one leading from Lennon's Cross Roads Church via the farms of W. I. West and J. W. Ellis, and crossing the Bladen and Evergreen road at J. W. Brown's near the Bladen and Columbus County line, continuing by the farms of M. A. Haywood, Evans, etc., and intersecting a public highway at A. M. Kelly's; and,

Whereas, said road is used as a school bus route, a rural mail route, and church road; and,

Whereas, at times said road becomes impassible and impairs travel:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners that the State Highway Commission be and it is hereby requested to take over and maintain said road; and,

Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be sent to the State Highway Commission in Raleigh and a copy be recorded on the Minutes of this Board.

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A regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County was held on the 4th day of November, 1935.

After discussion of the offer of the United States of America to aid by way of loan and grant in financing the construction of and equipping of new public school buildings and additions and improvements to existing public school buildings in Columbus County, the following Resolution numbered 10, and entitled "A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE UNITED STATES TO AID BY WAY OF LOAN AND GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF AND EQUIP*ING OF NEW PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN COLUMBUS COUNTY", was proposed by H. G. Avant, and read in full:

RESOLUTION NO. 10

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE UNITED STATES TO COLUMBUS COUNTY TO AID BY WAY OF LOAN AND GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF AND EQUIPING OF NEW PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN COLUMBUS COUNTY.

Be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County:

SECTION 1. That the offer of the United States of America to Columbus County to aid by way of loan and grant in financing the construction of and equipping of new public school buildings and additions and improvements to existing public school buildings in Columbus County, a copy of which offer reads as follows:

Subject to the Rules and Regulations (PWA Form No. 166, July 22, 1935, as amended to date) which are made a part hereof, the United States of America hereby offers to aid in financing the construction and equipping of new public school buildings and additions and improvements to existing public school buildings (herein called the "Project") by making a grant to the Board of Education of Columbus County in the amount of 45 per cent of the cost of the Project upon completion, as determined by the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works, but not to exceed, in any event, the sum of \$136,458, and by purchasing, at the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest thereon, from Columbus County through the Local Government Commission of North Carolina, obligations of the description set forth (or such other description as shall be mutually satisfactory) in the aggregate principal amount of \$168,000, less such amount of such obligations, if any, as said Local Government Commission may sell to purchasers other than the United

States of America:

- (a). Obligor: Columbus County:
- (b). Type: Negotiable, general obligation, serial coupon bond:
- (c). Denomination: \$1,000: (d) Date: October 1, 1935:
- (e). Interest rate and interest payment dates: Four per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on April 1 and October 1 in each year:
- (f). Place of payment: At the office of the Treasurer of Columbus County, Whiteville, North Carolina, or, at the option of the holder, at a bank or trust company in the Borough of Manhattan City and State of New York:
- (g) .Registerable as to principal only at the option of the holder:
- (h). Maturities: Payable \$7,000 on October 1 in each year from 1936 to 1941, \$8,000 on October 1 in each year from 1942 to 1945, \$9,000 on October 1 in each year from 1946 to 1951 and \$10,000 on October 1 in each year from 1952 to 1955, all inclusive:
- (i). Security: Payable as to both principal and interest from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limit as to rate or amount upon all the taxable property within the territorial limits of Columbus County.

Baldwin, Clerk to the Board be, and he is hereby authorized and directed forthwith to send to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works three certified copies of this Resolution and three certified copies of the proceedings of this regular meeting in connection with the adoption of this Resolution, and such further documents or proofs in connection with the acceptance of said offer as may be requested by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.
