Commissioner R. C. Benton introduced the following resolution, which was read:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$30,000.00 COLUMBUS COUNTY BONDS FOR A COUNTY HOME.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus: Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners, after careful consideration, has ascertained and found and does hereby declare:

- (a) At an election duly salled and held pursuant to the provisions of an act ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on February 5, 1937 and known as H. B. No. 139, an election was held on March 9, 1937 in Columbus County to vote upon the question as to whether or not the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County shall issue \$30,000.00 bonds of Columbus County to be known and designated as "Columbus County Bonds for a County Home".
- (b) A majority of the qualified voters of said County who voted at said election voted for the issuance of said bonds.
- (c) It is immediately necessary that the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County issue all of said \$30,000.00 bonds.

Section 2. There shall be issued negotiable coupon bonds of Columbus County in the aggregate sum of \$30,000.00 for the purpose of building and equipping a County Home for the aged and infirm in Columbus County under the provisions of the act mentioned in paragraph (a) of Section 1 of this resolution. Said bonds shall be designated "Columbus County Bonds for a County Home", shall consist of 30 bonds of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 30, inclusive, shall be dated July 1, 1937, and shall mature annually, July 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$2,000 1939 to 1953, inclusive, without option of prior payment. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate, not exceeding 5% per annum, to be determined at the time the bonds are sold, which interest shall be payable semiannually on the first days of January and July of each year, and both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company, in the City of New York, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment is legal tender for public or private debts.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County and countersigned by the Clerk of said Board and the seal of the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County shall be impressed upon each bond, and the interest coupons thereto attached shall bear the lithographed facsimile signature of said Chairman. WHEREAS, the undersigned, constituting the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, on the 1st day of July, 1937, met with Mr. Benjamin D. Riegal, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Riegal Paper Corporation, and other officials of said corporation, and at said meeting the undersigned ascertained that the corporation comtemplates the establishment and construction in Columbus County, North Carolina, of a plant for the manufacture of pulp, paper, containers, and similar products; and

WHEREAS, the establishment and operation of said plant will involve the expenditure of considerable monies within Columbus County and the acquirement of products and materials produced in said County, and the said industry will afford employment for a large number of people, thereby creating a substantial payroll, and in the opinion of the undersigned the establishment of said industry will be of material benefit to the people of Columbus County; and,

WHEREAS, the undersigned desire to cooperate fully with Reigal Paper Company and its officers and to assist them in every proper way;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, in regular meeting assembled on this July 6, 1937, as follows:

- 1. That the said Board agrees that the values of the lands acquired for and used in connection with the establishment and operation of said plant will not be enhanced or increased for and during a period of five (5) years from the acquirement thereof by said corporation.
- 2. That the structures and improvements placed upon the premises acquired by said corporation in the construction of said plant for operation will not be assessed for tax purposes until the completion of the construction of such improvements, and that during said period of construction the property of said corporation will be taxed only upon the values thereof existing at the time of its pyrchase.
- 3. That after the said corporation has acquired the properties contemplated by it and placed thereon the structures and improvements desired by it, the whole will be valued so that under the tax rate applied thereto the gross sum of taxes required to be paid by said corporation will not exceed annually the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars for the aforesaid period of five (5) years. Aforesaid taxes to begin when plant starts operation.
- 4. That the said Board of Commissioners will designate for construction by the State Highway & Public Works Commission a hard-surfaced road over a distance of approximately one and one-half (1½) miles, beginning at a point about three thousand (3000) feet Westwardly from the Western end of the bridge crossing Livingston Creek, and thence proceeding Northwardly and extending from State Highway No. 28, and that the undersigned will cooperate with the said State Highway & Public Works Commission and assist insofar as it is possible for them to do, in promptly obtaining the construction of said road.
- 5. The undersigned will designate to the State Highway & Public Works Commission for construction arroad beginning at the junction of the Southern end of Lateral A with the Main Canal of Columbus County Drainage District #2 leading Westwardly therefrom to Lake Waccamaw, and that the undersigned will cooperate with the said State Highway & Public Works Commission and assist insofar as it is possible for them to do, in promptly obtaining the construction of said road.
