EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS
COUNTY HELD ON THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER 1938.

A regular meeting of the Commissioners of Columbus County was held on the 3rd day of October, 1938.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, and on roll call the following answered present: W. L. Hobbs, Z. V. Williamson, R. C. Benton, W. M. Stephens, and H. G. Avant, Chairman.

The following were absent: None.

After discussion of the offer of the United States of America to aid by way of grant in financing the construction of a County Hospital, the following Resolution numbered 2 and entitled "A Resolution accepting the offer of the United States to the County of Columbus to aid by way of grant in financing the construction of County Hospital", was proposed by W. L. Hobbs and read in full.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF THE
UNITED STATES TO THE COMMISSIONERS OF
COLUMBUS COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA TO AID
BY WAY OF GRANT IN FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF COUNTY HOSPITAL.

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County:

Section 1. That the offer of the United States of America to the County of Columbus, to aid by way of grant in financing the construction of County Hospital, a copy of which reads as follows:

1. Subject to the terms and conditions (PWA Form No. 230 as amended to the date of this offer) which are made a part hereof the United States of America, hereby offers to aid in financing the construction of a hospital building, including necessary equipment the acquisition of necessary land and the improvements of grounds (herein called the "Project"), by making a grant to the County of Columbus, North Carolina (herein called the "Applicant"), in the amount of 45 percent of the cost of the Project upon completion, as determined by the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works (herein called the "Administrator"), but not to exceed, in any event, the sum of \$45,000.00.

2. By acceptance of this offer the Applicant covenants to begin work on the Project as early as possible but in no event later than 6 weeks from the date of this offer and to complete such Project with all practicable dispatch, and in any event, within 9 months from the commencement of construction.

3. This offer is made subject to the express condition that if the Administrator shall determine at any time that the Applicant has paid or agreed to pay, whether directly or indirectly a bonus, commission or fee to any person, firm or corporation for attempting to procure, an approval of the Applicant's application, or for alleged services in procuring or attempting to procure such approval, or for activities of the nature commonly known as lobbying performed or agreed to be performed in connection with the application, then the Administrator shall have the right in his discretion, to rescind this offer and any agreements resulting herefrom, and in the event of such rescission, the United States of America shall be under no further obligation hereunder.

Section 2. That the County of Columbus agrees to abide by all rules and regulations relating to such grant, a copy of which rules and regulations were annexed to the Government's offer and made a part thereof.

Section 3. That the Clerk to the Board, A. W. Baldwin, be and he is hereby authorized and directed forthwith to send to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works three certified copies of the Resolution and three certified copies of the proceedings of this meeting in connection with the adoption of this Resolution, and such further documents or proofs in connection with the acceptance of said offer as may be requested by the Federal Administration of Public Works.

Section 4. That it is hereby covenanted that work on the project described in the offer will be commenced as soon as possible and that the progress of the work will be planned so that the project will be completed in any event by July 1st, 1939.
