#### RESOLUTION

ORDERED: that the following resolution be recorded relative to borrowing Twenty Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars for General County purposes, same being renewal note.

Be it ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that one note of the County of Columbus for General County purposes be executed in the sum of Twenty Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars dated October 20th, 1938, maturing April 20th, 1939.

The above note bearing interest at the rate of  $3\frac{1}{4}$  percent per annum, interest payable at maturity; both principal and interest of said note payable to Farmers and Merchants Bank of Fair Bluff, N. C. in anticipation of 1938 taxes and that said note be sold or hypothecated and the proceeds thereof turned into the General Fund of said County of Columbus.

Be it further ordered that the full faith and credit of the County of Columbus be pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest of said note at maturity.

On April 20th, 1939, the County of Columbus for value received, promises to pay to the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Fair Bluff, N. C., the sum of Twenty Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars with interest at  $3\frac{1}{4}$  per cent per annum from date.

It is hereby certified and recited that each and every act, condition and thing required to be done, to have happened and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this note, has been done, has happened and has been performed in full and strict compliance with the Constitution and laws of the State of North Carolina, and that this note is within every debt and other limit prescribed by law, and the faith and credit of County of Columbus are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this note, according to its terms.

ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION  
FIXING MINIMUM RATES

WHEREAS, a thorough investigation has been made of the hourly wage rates which are being paid in the Town of Whiteville, and Columbus County, N. C. which is

the locality in which the proposed project (hereinafter referred to as "Project") is to be constructed by the County of Columbus to employees in each trade or occupation engaged in work of a nature similar to the work to be performed in the construction of said Project, and the prevailing hourly wage rates being paid in such locality to such employees for such work have been determined by said County Commissioners by conferring with contractors and mechanics in the locality.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Columbus that the following rates for the respective trades or occupations listed below shall be and are hereby fixed as the minimum hourly wage rates and have been determined in accordance with rates prevailing for work of a similar nature in the locality in which the project is to be constructed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing list of trades or occupations includes to the best of our knowledge, all the classifications of employees who will be engaged in work on said Project other than executive, supervisory, administrative, clerical or other non-manual workers as such.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there be transmitted with this resolution the substantiating data upon which the foregoing determination is based.

I FURTHER CERTIFY that the foregoing resolution is on file and of record in my office as Clerk to the Board of Commissioners of the County of Columbus.

ORDINANCE BY THE BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS COUNTY,  
CHANGING THE TYPE OF BUILDING OF THE  
PROPOSED COLUMBUS COUNTY HOSPITAL  
FROM TWO STORIES TO ONE STORY.

WHEREAS, it has been suggested by the Duke Foundation that the type of hospital building proposed for Whiteville, Columbus County, be changed from two stories to one story, and since the local physicians acquiesce in this suggestion for the reason that it is desirable from the standpoint of the maintenance of plant, the convenience to patients, attending physicians, nurses, help, as well as the general public.

The following resolution was made by R. C. Benton and seconded by W. L. Hobbs:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, that since it has been recommended by competent authorities that it is advisable to make the proposed Columbus County Hospital (approved P. W. A. Project No. 1452-F) a one story structure instead of two stories, we do hereby agree to build the said hospital of one story construction instead of two stories as originally drawn.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Architect Leslie N. Boney, of Wilmington, N. C. be and is hereby authorized and directed to change plans from the two story building to one story building and forward said plans to Regional Office of P.W.A. in Atlanta at the earliest possible date for the approval of Regional Director, with the request that he name earliest convenient date for the receipt of contract bids.
