Minutes of the last meetings being read and approved, the following business was transacted.

Ordered: that Mrs. Ordie L. Wright, Clarendon, N. C., be allowed to pay taxes due on Mrs. Mollie Richardson, Williams Township, for years 1924 thru 1938 at par plus 6% and 1/2 court cost.

Ordered: that J. E. Thompson, Hallsboro, N. C., be allowed to pay taxes due on the W. E. Pope property, Bogue Township, for years 1927 thru 1938 inclusive, by paying the principal amount thereof less \$45.24 representing polls, dogs and personal tax, plus 6% and 1/2 court cost.

Ordered: that Lee Ward, Nakina, N. C., be allowed to pay his taxes due for years 1937 by paying at par plus 6% and no court cost.

Ordered: that Hattie Boyd Estate be segregated for year 1941 so that Louise Campbell can pay her portion consisting of 1/2 real estate on valuation of \$233 and on tobacco barn at a valuation of \$50 and that Annie Boyd can pay on her part at a valuation of \$407.

Ordered: that C. W. Strickland, Cerro Gordo Township, be refunded \$4.88 due to error in listing.

Ordered: that A. H. Ray, Lees Township, be allowed to pay his 1936 years taxes due at par plus 6% and 1/2 court cost.

Ordered: that A. W. Fowler, Whiteville Township, be refunded on \$2250 valuation on 1941 taxes due to error in listing.

Ordered: that two lots of Mary Powell (col), Whiteville Townshhp, be segregated so as to allow Greer Powell to pay on lot now owned by him and listed in the name of Sarah Langley for 1940 valued at \$200 and in prior years on the name of Mary Powell, payment to be made on pro rata share of personal property.

Ordered: that W. M.
