RESOLUTION FIXING THE DETAILS AND FORM AND MANNER OF EXECUTION OF \$1,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby find and declare:

- (a) That an order authorizing \$1,000,000 school building bonds of Columbus County was finally passed on February 17, 1947, which order was approved by the vote of a majority of the qualified voters of said County who voted at an election duly called and held on March 25, 1947.
- (b) That the period of the life of the school buildings to be erected, remodeled and enlarged, pursuant to said order, is estimated as a period of thirty years from February 17, 1948, being a date not later than one year after the final passage of said order, and that said period expires February 17,1978.

Section 2. That for the purpose of providing the school improvements pursuant to said order, such school improvements being necessary in order to maintain the constitutional six months' school term, the negotiable coupon bonds of Columbus County shall be issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000 consisting of 1,000 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, dated December 1,1947, maturing annually, June 1, \$18,000 1950 to 1954, \$20,000 1955 to 1959 and \$45,000 1960 to 1977, all inclusive, without option of prior payment, and bearing interest

at a rate or rates not exceeding 6% per annum to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the bonds are sold, which interest shall be payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December of each year, both the principal of and the interest on said bonds to be payable at The Chase National Bank of the City of New York in New York City, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, at the respective dates of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 3. That said \$1,000,000 school building bonds may be issued from time to time in amounts as may be determined by resolution of the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, and said bonds shall be designated "School Building Bonds, Series _____", the bonds to be issued at any one time to be designated by a different series letter.

Section 4. That said \$1,000,000 school building bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the Clerk of said Board, under the corporate seal of the said Board, and the annexed interest Coupons shall be executed with the facsimile signature of said Clerk. Said bonds and coupons and the endorsements to be printed upon the reverse of said bonds shall be in substantially the following forms:
