C. ^Highway and Public Works Commission to place on the State Road System of roads and maps a road from a point of the intersection of the Red Bug road at Wiley Boone's place to run West for about a distance of three quarters of a mile. This road serves or will serve about twenty seven families.
- 3. Repair and grade about three hundred yards of road connecting Farmers Union Road and Lake Waacamaw school bus road which would save about two miles bus traveling on which no one lives.
- 4. Petition for a hard surface road, beginning at the end of a hard surface project now almost complete at the forks of road and corner of Yates Malpass farm formerly known as the Blake D. Applewhite place and runs south by Livingston Chapel Church to Bordeaux, a store at the fork of roads in Shackle town approximate four miles. Due to the volume of heavy traffic the nature surface will not hold up and transportation often difficult.
- 5. Have the Rough and Ready Road beginning near Fair Bluff school house by way of Hinson's Cross Roads Baptist Church to Waitus Green's home where said road intersects with the road leading from Tabor City to Cerro Gordo placed on the list for immediate work and improvements and hardsurface. This is an important farm-to-market road and will mean much to the towns of Fair Bluff, Cerro Gordo, Tabor City and Chadbourn as well as the countryside people.
