The Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, North Carolina, convened at the Courthouse in Whiteville, North Carolina, the usual place of meeting, in regular session, at 10 o'clock, A. M., on January 4, 1954.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$65,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby find and declare:

- (a) That an order authorizing \$65,000 School Building Bonds of the County of Columbus was finally passed on No ember 16, 1953.
- (b) That none of said bonds has been issued and no notes have been issued in anticipation of the receipts of the proceeds of said bonds.
- (c) That the period of the life of the school building to be erected pursuant to said order si estimated as a period of thirty years from November 16, 1954, a date not later than one year after the final passage of said order, and that said period expires November 10, 1904.

Section 2. That for the purpose of erecting the school building pursuant to said order, such school building being necessary in order to maintain the constitutional sic months' school term in Columbus County, there shall be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the County of Columbus, in the aggregate principal amount of \$65,000, designated "School Building Bonds", consisting of 65 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 05, inclusive, dated December 1, 1953, maturing annually, June 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$10,000 1956 to 1959, inclusive, \$5,000 1960 to 1962, inclusive, and \$10,000 1963, without option of prior payment, and bearing interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding 6% per annum to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the bonds are sold, which interest to the maturity thereof shall be payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December of each year, and both the principal of and the interest on said bonds shall be payable at The Hanover Bank, in the Borough of Manhattan, City and State of New York, or, at the option of the holder or registered owner, at the Wachovia Bank and Trust Company, in the City of Raleigh, State of

North Carolina, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, at the respective dates of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 3. That said School Building Bonds shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and by the Clerk of said Board, under the corporate seal of said Board, and the interest coupons to be attached to said bonds shall be executed with the fassimile signature of said Clerk. Said bonds and coupons and the endorsements to be printed upon the reverse of said bonds shall be in substantially the following forms:
