Commissioner Ward introduced the following resolution which d:

was read:

RLSOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$370,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS, SERIES B.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby find and declare:

(a) That an order authorizing \$740,000 School Building Bonds of the County of Columbus was finally passed on January 24, 1955, which order was approved by the vote of a majority of the qualified voters of said County who voted at an election duly called and held on March 5, 1955.

(b) That on June ó, 1955 said Board passed a resolution fixing the details and form and manner of execution of said \$740,000 bonds, which resolution is entitled: "RESOLUTION FIXING THE DETAILS AND FORM AND MANNER OF EXECU* TION OF \$740,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS", and is hereinafter referred to as the "Resolution".

(c) That \$370,000 of said bonds have heretofore been issued pursuant to said Resolution and order and a resolution passed on June 6, 1955 entitled: "RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$370,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS SERIES A", SAID \$370,000 bonds consisting of 370 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 370, inclusive, designated "School Building Bonds, SeriesA", dated June 1, 1955, and maturing annually, June 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$12,000 1957, \$6,000 1955 to 1963, inclusive, \$12,000 1964, \$15,000 1965 to 1964, inclusive, and \$10,000 1985, without option of prior payment.

(d) That it is necessary that Columbus County, acting as an administrative agent of the State in providing a State system of public schools, provide for the issuance of the unissued \$370,00 bonds authorized by said order.

Section 2. That said unissued \$370,000 bonds shall be issued at this time, shall be issued at this time, shall be designated "School Building Bonds, Series B, and shall consist of 370 bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 370, inclusive, and said bonds shall mature annually, June 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$6,000 1958 to 1962, inclusive, \$22,000 1963, \$18,000 1964, and \$15,000 1965 to 1984, inclusive, without option of prior payment.

Section 3. That the action of the County Attorney in applying to the Local Government Commission to advertise and sell said \$370,000 School Building Bonds, Series B, be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Upon motion of Commissioner Council, seconded by Commissioner Buffkin, the foregoing resolution entitled: 'RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOT THE ISSUANCE OF #370,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS, SERIES B", was passed by the following vote:

Ordered: that salary of Alice S. Burns be set at \$15.00 per day and \$10.00 per day expense.

Ordered: that Alice S. Burns be named acting Clerk to Board.

Ordered: that Ossie Jacobs, Bolton Township, be allowed a release to tax collector for \$19.00 on error made in 1955 listing.

Ordered: that Chairman of Board be authorized to sign request for expenses of administering polie vaccine and to enter into agreement that all funds furnished will be used solely for said services with any unused portion to be returned to agency furnishing same.

Ordered: that the tax collector be allowed to accept 1952 and 1953 taxes of L. A. Meares, Whiteville Township, at par.

Ordered: that order passed on Sept. 6, 1955, and recorded in minute Book No. 14 page 101 regarding taxes of Miles F. Flynn be rescinded as this has been properly handled by an order passed by the Board on Oct. 4, 1954.

Ordered: that Hosea Brown, R-2, Chadbourn be allowed to pay the 1937

tax in Tatum Township in the name of Mrs. M. M. Brown at par.

Ordered: that personal property tax listed in the name of Robert S. Britt, R-1, Whiteville, Whiteville Township, for the year 1955 be reduced from \$2931 to \$2731 and that the tax collector be given a release on a \$200.00 valuation as this is on a 1941 truck listed in error.

Ordered: that the personal property tax listed in the name of William Walker, Whiteville Township, for the year 1955 be reduced from \$735.00 to \$380.00 and that the tax collector be given a release on a \$355 valuation , as this was caused by listing a 1950 Ford truck as a 1954.

RESOLVED that in the opinion of County Agent Raper and the Board of Commissioners an emergency has arisen in Columbus when White Fringe Beetle attack 16 farms in an area of Columbus County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners respectfully request Representative and State Senator Williamson to petition our U. S. Congress and U. S. Senate to grant funds to Columbus County for procuring chemical to treat said lands in Columbus County to avoid a wide spread attack of White Fringe Beetle Cost is now estimated at \$3,000 to treat the 16 farms now involved.

Ordered: that monthly appropriation be made payable to Miss Edna Creech, Librarian as a salary item rather than an appropriation to Columbus County Library.
