The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office April 1, 1957 at 10 A. M. it being first Monday:

The following business was transacted:

Ordered: That Ivan W. Britton be exempt from poll tax due to permanent injuries to his right hand.

Ordered: That the voting machines not be sent back to the factory to be changed to the one shot voting system unless the towns are willing to pay the expense of same. (\$604.00) This will be deducted from future use of the machines.

Ordered: That additional insurance be added to boilers which could not be included in the original policy due to repairs needed on three of the boilers at that time.

Ordered: That increases be made in insurance policies covering buildings/

Ordered: That insurance be increased to full coverage on all county owned property where boilers are included in the property.

Ordered: That David McMillan be allowed a peddlers licenses to sell in Columbus County. He is a disabled veteran.

Ordered: That Jane Ellis be raised from \$240.00 to \$250.00 per month effective April 1, 1957 and that Pearl Fowler and Minnette Lovette be raised from \$250.00 to \$260.00 per month retroactive March 1, 1957.

Ordered: That Southeastern N. C. Development Association be allowed \$100.00 from the Contingence Fund. To be used for promotional work.

Ordered: That the first Monday in July be set as the time for selling property for delinquent taxes.

Ordered: That taxes due on lands listed by Clyde R. Williams in Whiteville Township (Negro Gym) for years 1937 through 1942 be cancelled and that the valuation for years 1943 through 1956 be reduced by one half due to over valuation and that the Parents Teachers Association be allowed to pay one half of said taxes as settlement in full for said years and that the Tax Collector be given a release for the excess.
