

(b) That all of the territory described in said petition is located in the County of Columbus and that no municipal corporation or any part of the territory of a municipal corporation is included in said territory,

(c) That said petition was duly signed by 119 freeholders residing within the proposed sanitary district, that there are 152 freeholders residing within the proposed sanitary district, and that the number of resident freeholders who signed said petition is more than 51% of the freeholders residing within said proposed sanitary district.

(d) That said petition request the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus to take all necessary action required by Article 12 of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina for the creation of a sanitary district comprising the territory described therein and sets forth the boundaries of the proposed sanitary district and the objects proposed to be accomplished by the creation of such district.
