Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held at 2 o'clock, P.M. on Friday, March 4, 1960, at Riegelwood Community Center, Riegelwood, North Carolina, which public hearing will be held by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus and a representative of the North Carolina State Board of Health, upon a petition, filed with the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, proposing the dissolution of the Riegelwood Sanitary District, in Columbus County, as created and established by resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959.

The boundaries of said Riegelwood Sanitary District as described and set out in said resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health are as follows:

This district is located in Columbus County, North Carolina, about one and one-half miles Northwestwardly from the Community of Acme and constitutes the developed areas and adjacent areas of the community of Riegelwood (unincorporated). 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At the hour of 2:00 o'clock, P. M., the Chairman announced that, pursuant to a notice duly posted and published, this was the date and hour fixed by the Board of Commissioners and the State Health Director of the North Carolina State Board of Health for the joint public hearing upon a petition filed with the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus on January 23, 1960 petitioning for the dissolution of the Riegelwood Sanitary District in Columbus County created and established by resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959.

The Chairman announced that the Board of Commissioners and the representative of the State Board of Health would immediately hear any and all freeholders resident within said Riegelwood Sanitary District as created and established by resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959 and any other interested person concerning the dissolution of said Riegelwood Sanitary District.

No freeholder resident within said Riegelwood Sanitary District or other interested person appeared, either in person or by attorney, to protest against the dissolution of said Riegelwood Sanitary District, and the Clerk announced that no protest in writing, signed by any resident freeholder or other interested person had been presented.
