WHEREAS, said Hospital Board of trustees proposes to construct an addition to said Hospital at an estimated cost of \$141,000.00 to be financed with 55% Federal funds, 17% State funds and the remaining 28% from local funds; and

WHEREAS, the said Board of Trustees have on hand the said 28% and have requested the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County to pass a resolution approving and authorizing the proposed improvement, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County go on record as approving and authorizing said improvement and hereby authorize the said Board of Trustees to proceed with the proposed project. Be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of trustees is hereby empowered to select and Architect to prepare plans and specifications and to execute contracts for the construction and equipping of the said hospital addition. Be it futher

"WHEREAS, a petition proposing the dissolution of the Riegelwood Sanitary District in Columbus County as created and established by resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959 was filed with the Board of Commissioners on January 23, 1960, which petition is set forth in the minutes of the February 1, 1960 meeting of said Board, and is as follows:

To the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

We, the undersigned, being resident freeholders of the Riegelwood Sanitary District in Columbus County, North Carolina, created and established by resolution of the North Carolina State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959, under the provisions of Article of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, which Sanitary District has no outstanding indebtedness, respectfully petition that said Sanitary District be dissolved and that the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, being the County in which all of the resident freeholders of said Sanitary District are located, take all necessary action required by said Article 12 of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, particularly Section 130-151 thereof, for the accomplishment of such dissolution.

The boundaries of said Riegelwood Sanitary District, as described and set out in said resolution of the State Board of Health adopted on July 16, 1959 are as follows:

This district is located in Columbus County, North Carolina, about one and one-half miles northwestwardly from the Community of Acme and constitutes the developed areas and adjacent areas of the community of Riegelwood (unincorporated). It is bounded more specifically as follows: Beginning at a point in the Northern right-of-way line of North Carolina highway No. 87 where the eastern right-of-way line of the entrance road to the Riegel Paper Corporation plant (100' wide R/W) intersects and running thence N 47° - 39' E and along the eastern right-of-way line of said entrance road, 1,370 feet to the southern right-of-way line of the Row Water Line (Wilmington - King's Bluff) controlled by the City of Wilmington, North Carolina (30' wide R/W); thence S 56° - 35' E, 930 feet to the western right-of-way line of the Atlantic Coastline Railroad Company's Riegel Spur tract (55' from center line of tract); thence southwardly and along the said western right-of-way line of the Atlantic Coastline as it runs 3,570 feet to the northern right-of-way line of the Seaboard Airline Railroad Company's Wilmington-Hamlet line (100' from center line of tract); thence N 66° - 05' W and along said Seaboard Airline northern right-of-way line 458.2 feet to the right-of-way of North Carolina highway 87, continuing across said highway S 65° - 00' E, and along the Seaboard Airline northern right-of-way line 3,930 feet to the western limit of the Old Cross Seed Company Koester Tract (now owned by the Riegel Paper Corporation); thence S. 22° - 30' W and with the Seaboard Airline right-of-way 48 feet to a Stone marked "D. L. 6"; thence S 65° - 00' E and along the northern Seaboard Airline right-of-way line (52 feet from center of tract) 2,036.7 feet; thence N 35° - 00' E, 1,176.58 feet; Thence N 46° - 00' E 1,256.96 feet; thence S 14° - 30' E, along Pretty Branch 805.86 feet; thence N 48° - 00' E, 1,515.7 feet to the northern right-of-way line of said highway No. 87; thence S 30° - 00' E, and along said northern right-of-way line 1,775 feet to the point of beginning.

"WHEREAS, a petition proposing ~~the~~ the creation of a sanitary district in Columbus County was filed with the Board of Commissioners on January 23, 1960, which petition is set forth in the minutes of the February 1, 1960 meeting of said Board, and is as follows:

PETITION FOR THE CREATION OF THE TERRITORY HEREIN DESCRIBED AS A SANITARY DISTRICT

To the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

We, the undersigned, being resident freeholders within the boundaries of the territory described below, respectfully petition that such territory be created as a sanitary district and that the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, North Carolina, being the County in which all of the petitioning freeholders are located, take all necessary action required by Article 12 of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina for the creation of a sanitary district comprising such territory, the objects proposed to be accomplished by the creation of such district being the acquisition, construction, maintenance and operation of a water supply and distribution system, a sewerage system, sewage disposal or treatment plant, fire protection facilities and such other utilities as may be necessary for the preservation and promotion of the public health and sanitary welfare within the district.

All of the territory proposed to be included in such sanitary district is located in Columbus County, North Carolina, and the boundaries of such territory are as follows:

BEGINNING at a point where the Northern right of way line (100.0 feet from its center line) of the Seaboard Airline Railroad intersects the center line of N. C. Highway # 87 (said Highway right of way being 100.0 feet in width) said intersection being just Northwestward of Acme, N. C.; running thence from said beginning point and along the Northern right of way line of said Seaboard Airline Railroad North 66 deg. 04 min. West 84.93 feet to a point in the Southwestern right of way line of said N. C. Highway #87; running thence along the northern right of way line of said railroad North 66 deg. 04 min. West 5,744.3 feet to a concrete monument in the Western line of the formerly Cross Seed Co's Koester Tract, said monument being located North 34 deg. 14 min. C. said point being 35.0 feet Southwardly from the center line of the present pipe line; running thence along the Southern edge of said right of way to an iron pipe which is 55.0 feet Westwardly when measured perpendicular to the center of the most Western spur tracts of the Riegel Paper Co., said iron pipe being the following courses and distances as measured in general along the Southern edge of said pipe-line right of way from the preceding point, South 51 deg. 31 min. East 176.4 feet, South 53 deg. 46 min. East 293.4 feet, South 54 deg. 52 min. East 291.6 feet and South 55 deg. 55 min. West 52.99 feet from the preceding point; running thence South 27 deg. 35 min. West 192.1 feet to a point, the beginning of a curve to the left; running thence along the arc of said curve to the end of said curve, said point being South 4 deg. 13 min. 30 sec. West 842.1 feet from the preceding point; running thence South 19 deg. 08 min. East 1,885.0 feet to said intersection with the Northern right of way line of aforementioned Seaboard Airline Railroad; running thence along the Northern right of way line of said Seaboard Airline Railroad North 66 deg. 04 min. West 450.5 feet to a point where the Northern line intersects the Northeast right of way line of aforementioned N. C. The Board of Commissioners nominated L. P. Ward, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners for outstanding County Official Award. Nomination will be sent to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

Ordered: That Taxes listed in the name of Haywood Smith for the year 1941 be accepted at par.

Ordered: That a 120 acre tract of land valued for tax purposes at \$660.00 and listed in the name of Jas. E. Hobbs, Ransom Township be segregated from other lands so that Riegel Paper Corporation may pay the taxes on the above 120 acres for the year 1959, and that upon payment of this tax the tax lien will be released on said tract.

Ordered: That taxes listed in the name of E. J. Hinson Heirs for the years 1956-1957-1958 and 1959 be segregated so that Cleon Hinson be allowed to pay taxes for the above years on a 1 2/10 acres tract valued for tax purposes at \$100.00 which came from a 28 acre tract. Upon payment of above portion of tax the tax lien will be released on said 1 2/10 acres. The portion to be paid by Cleon Hinson 8.4 % or \$9.14.

Ordered: That Raulis Todd, Chadbourn Township be given a refund of \$6.37. In 1959 a 1954 Ford Automobile was listed rather than a 1950 Ford. Send refund to Chadbourn, N. C.
