

The Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, North Carolina, met in regular session at the Courthouse in Whiteville, the regular place of meeting, at 10 o'clock, A.M., Tuesday, September 4, 1962, Monday, September 3, 1962, having been a legal holiday.

The following business was transacted:

Commissioner Buffkin introduced the following order authorizing bonds which was read:

ORDER AUTHORIZING \$2,000,000  
SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS

WHEREAS, The Whiteville City Board of Education has certified to this Board a resolution passed on September 4, 1962, showing that adequate school facilities are not now available in the Whiteville City Administrative Unit to comply with the requirements of Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution of North Carolina for the maintenance of schools six months in every year, and that it is necessary, in order to maintain such six months' school term as required by said Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, to erect additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodel, enlarge and reconstruct existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquire necessary land and equipment therefor, the estimated cost of which is \$ 436,400.00; and

WHEREAS, The Columbus County Board of Education has certified to this Board a resolution passed on September 4, 1962, showing that adequate school facilities are not now available in the Columbus County Administrative Unit to comply with the requirements of Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution of North Carolina for the maintenance of schools six months in every year, and that it is necessary, in order to maintain such six months' school term as required by said Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, to erect additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodel, enlarge and reconstruct existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquire necessary land and equipment therefor, the estimated cost of which is \$1,563,600.00; and

WHEREAS, said resolutions request the Board of Commissioners to take all necessary steps, by the issuance of bonds or otherwise, in order that such school facilities may be provided; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has carefully examined the facts and has determined and does hereby find as a fact that said statements of said resolutions are true and that it has become the duty of said Board of Commissioners, acting as an administrative agent of the State in providing a State system of public schools, to order the issuance of bonds of the County of Columbus so that the school facilities mentioned in paragraph 1 of this order and in said resolutions may be provided in order to maintain the six months' school term in the County of Columbus as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

1. That, pursuant to The County Finance Act, as amended, School Building Bonds of the County of Columbus, North Carolina, shall be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other funds available for such purpose, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor in order to provide additional school facilities in said County to maintain the six months' school term as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution.

2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

3. That a statement of the County debt has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said Act.

The Board thereupon designated the County Accountant as the officer to make and file with the Clerk the statement of debt and assessed valuation of the County as required by The County Finance Act, as amended, to be filed before the final passage of the order which was introduced at this meeting.

Thereupon the County Accountant filed with the Clerk, in the presence of the Board, the statement of debt and assessed valuation as so required, which statement shows (a) that the percentage which the net school debt bears to the assessed valuation of the County is 6.788% and (b) that the County has assumed all outstanding indebtedness for school purposes of every city, town, school district, school taxing district, township or other political subdivision in the County.

The Clerk thereupon confirmed the recital in the statement of the County Accountant with reference to the assumption by the County of school indebtedness.

The Clerk also called to the attention of the Board the following provision of The County Finance Act, as amended:

"Provided, further, that if any county shall assume all outstanding indebtedness for school purposes of every city, town, school district, school taxing district, township or other political subdivision therein, the limit of the net debt of such county for school purposes, including the debt so assumed, shall be eight per cent (8%)."

Thereupon the order entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$2,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS" was passed on first reading.

On motion duly made and unanimously carried the Board fixed 10 o'clock, A. M., September 17, 1962 as the hour and date for the public hearing upon the foregoing order, and directed the Clerk to publish said order, together with the appended note as required by The County Finance Act, as amended, in the News Reporter not later than the tenth day before said date.

A motion was made, duly seconded and carried, to rescind an order of August 28th to disallow an invoice in the amount of \$52.56 for the Sheriff. It was ordered that this invoice be paid.

The County Attorney was directed to prepare an appropriate resolution or formal letter upon the retirement of Dr. Albert Coates, taking note of the services he has rendered the counties of North Carolina through the Institute of Government throughout the years.

Ordered: that Burvin Hooks, Bogue Township, be refunded \$2.00 Poll Tax for the year 1961. This man was in service and was erroneously charged Poll Tax.

Ordered that Poll Tax listed in the name of Burvin Hooks, Bogue Township, be cancelled for the year 1962. This man was in service as of January 1962.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Ira L. Bost, Chadbourn Township, be reduced by \$198.00. A 1959 Ford was valued at \$1,040.00 rather than \$850.00 as it should have been.

Ordered: that Luke H. Green be refunded \$2.00 Poll Tax in Cerro Gordo Township for the year 1958, due to the fact that he is in the armed service.

Ordered: that the Tax Collector be given a release on a valuation of \$750.00 for the year 1962 on taxes listed in the name of James Hall Heirs. This was valued at \$900.00 and should have been \$150.00-- Bogue Township. This property was listed in 1961 for six years at \$150.00 per year, and it should go back to \$150.00 for the year 1962.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of James W. Smith, Whiteville Township, be cancelled for the year 1949. This was listed by his wife through error and was also listed by him.

Ordered: that taxes listed for the year 1962 in the name of D. C. Atkins Heirs in Bolton Township be segregated so that Riegel Paper Corporation may pay the tax on a 100-Acre tract known as J. Q. Little, valued at \$720.00; and on a 115-Acre tract, known as the Aaron Little, valued at \$694.00; and also on a 107-Acre tract known as (no description), valued at \$865.00. Upon payment of the above taxes, these tracts shall be clear of tax lien for the year 1962.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Fred Nobles, Chadbourn Township, be accepted at par for the year 1937.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Paul C. Batten, Waccamaw Township, be reduced in value by \$1500.00 for the year 1962. This house burned in 1960.

ROAD PETITION: 1. Welches Creek Township. Road known as "Bluefield Road" off secondary road # 1722, leading to secondary road # 1710; is 3/4 mile long and there are five occupied homes on it.

Ordered: that the sheriff summon the following good and lawful men and women to serve as jurors at the following terms of Court:

Upon motion, the Board adjourned until 7 p.m. at which time the Hospital Board of Trustees and the Columbus County Medical Association will meet with the Board of Commissioners.
