

The Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, North Carolina, met in regular session at the Courthouse in Whiteville, the regular place of meeting, at 10 o'clock, A.M., on October 1, 1962.

The Chairman announced that this was the date and hour fixed by the Board for the public hearing upon the order entitled:

"ORDER AUTHORIZING \$850,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS",

and that the Board would immediately hear any and all citizens and taxpayers who might desire to protest against the issuance of said bonds.

No citizen or taxpayer of the County appeared, either in person or by attorney, to protest against the issuance of any of said bonds, and the Clerk announced that no protest in writing, signed by any citizen or taxpayer, had been presented.

Thereupon, upon motion of Commissioner W. B. Buffkin, seconded by Commissioner A. O. Burns and carried, the order introduced and passed on first reading on September 17, 1962, entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$850,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS", was read a second time and placed upon its final passage. The vote upon the final passage of said order was:

The Chairman then announced that the order entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$850,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS" had passed.

The Clerk was thereupon directed to publish said order in The News Reporter once in each of two successive weeks, and to publish at the foot of said order the appended note as required by The County Finance Act, as amended.

Thereupon Commissioner Robert E. Sessions introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$2,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS AND AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$850,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS TO THE VOTERS ON NOVEMBER 6, 1962

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. At the general election, the same being the regular election for County officers, to be held in the County of Columbus between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on Tuesday, November 6, 1962, and at the same places at which such election will be held (being the same places at which the last preceding election for members of the General Assembly was held with such changes as may have been ordered pursuant to law), there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the County of Columbus the following questions:

1. Shall an order finally passed on September 17, 1962, authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina, to contract

a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue School Building Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other funds available for such purpose, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor in order to provide additional school facilities in the County of Columbus to maintain the six months' school term in said County as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

2. Shall an order finally passed on October 1, 1962, authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue County Hospital Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$850,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for remodeling and enlarging the Columbus County Hospital in Whiteville and acquiring any necessary land and equipment therefor, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Section 2. For said election the regular registration books for elections in said County shall be used and such books shall be open for the registration of voters not theretofore registered from 9 A.M. until sunset on each day, beginning Saturday, October 13, 1962 and closing Saturday, October 27, 1962. On each Saturday during such registration period such books shall be open at the polling places. Saturday, November 3, 1962, shall be Challenge Day. For said election the registrars and judges appointed for the general election shall act as registrars and judges.

Section 3. The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners shall cause a notice to be published in The News Reporter, at least thirty days before the election, and thereafter twice before the election at intervals of at least one week between publications reading substantially as follows:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the general election, the same being the regular election for County officers, to be held in the County of Columbus between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on Tuesday, November 6, 1962, and at the same places at which such election will be held (being the same places at which the last preceding election for members of the General Assembly was held with such changes as may have been ordered pursuant to law), there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the County of Columbus the following questions:

1. Shall an order finally passed on September 17, 1962 authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue School Building Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other funds available for such purpose, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor in order to provide additional school facilities in the County of Columbus to maintain the six months' school term in said County as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

2. Shall an order finally passed on October 1, 1962, authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue County Hospital Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$850,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for remodeling and enlarging the Columbus County Hospital in Whiteville and acquiring any necessary land and equipment therefor, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Each of the questions hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the order referred to in said question.

If said bonds are issued a tax will be levied upon all taxable property in the County of Columbus for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds.

For said election the regular registration books for elections in said County will be used, and such books will be open for the registration of voters, not theretofore registered, from 9 A.M. until sunset on each day beginning Saturday, October 13, 1962 and closing Saturday, October 27, 1962. On each Saturday during such registration period said books will be open at the polling places. Saturday, November 3, 1962, is Challenge Day.

The registrars and judges appointed for the general election will act as registrars and judges.

Buffkin, the foregoing resolution entitled: "RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$2,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS AND AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$850,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS TO THE VOTERS ON NOVEMBER 6, 1962" was passed by the following vote:

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Civil Defense Director, Lathal R. Wayne read the following resolutions which were unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the President, by Executive Order No. 10427 dated January 16, 1953, and later executive orders has directed the Office of Emergency Planning to exercise certain designated authority vested in the President by Public Law 875 (81st Congress) as amended:

WHEREAS, Public Law 875 provides for a continuing means of assistance by the Federal Government to state and local governments, in carrying out their responsibilities to alleviate suffering and damage resulting from major disasters, to repair essential public facilities and to foster development of state and local organizations and plans to cope with such disasters:

WHEREAS, Section 166-11 of Chapter 166 of North Carolina Statutes provides "In carrying out the provisions of this chapter, the Governor is authorized to utilize the services, equipment, supplies, and facilities of existing departments, offices, and agencies of the State of the political subdivisions thereof, and the governing bodies of the political subdivisions of the State are authorized to utilize the services, equipment, supplies, and facilities of their respective subdivisions, to the maximum extent practicable, and the officers and personnel of all such departments, offices, and agencies are required to co-operate with and extend such services and facilities to the Governor and to the Civil Defense Organizations of the State upon request. This authority shall extend to all disasters and for Civil Defense training purposes. (1957, c950, s 5).;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in order to utilize the resources of Columbus County, its municipalities, the State of North Carolina and those of the Federal Government to the greatest advantage, and bring about a clear integration of all these activities, with those carried out by the cities, towns, nearby counties, the American Red Cross, and other similiar agencies that function during disasters in Columbus County, Civil Defense Director of Columbus County is hereby designated as the person charged with the coordination of Federal and State Assistance in natural disasters within the purview of PL 875 and other applicable Federal Regulations.

THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR SHALL:

1. In accordance with instructions given by the County Commissioners of Columbus County and the Chairman, Civil Defense Council, Columbus County, coordinate all relief activities in major disasters. Operating responsibilities shall remain with those agencies that are at present charged by law with such responsibilities.

2. Coordinate plans of County and Municipal agencies made in anticipation of their responsibilities in the event of any major disaster.

3. Foster the development of such local organizations and plans as may be necessary to cope with any major disaster.

4. Advise and cooperate with officials of the Office of Emergency Operations, Executive Office of the President and the Armed Forces and other Federal Agencies located within the area of or contiguous to Columbus County to act for the Office of Emergency Planning if and when requested; prior to, during, or after any incident in which the Governor requests assistance under Public Law 875.

WHEREAS, the general assembly of the State of North Carolina did provide under Chapter 314, SESSION LAW of 1959, an act to provide in the event of enemy attack upon the State of North Carolina for the continuity of the orderly functions of the government of local sub-divisions of the state; by authorized local political sub-divisions to enact resolutions and ordinances relating to succession for all officers having emergency government functions:

WHEREAS, this bill was passed and ratified on the 21st day of April 1959, by said general assembly,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. Board of County Commissioners-- In the event of the death, absence, physical or mental incapacity of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, then the next senior member shall assume such office. If there is no clear line of seniority, then an election shall be held immediately to select a temporary chairman. In the event of the death, absence, physical or mental disability of a sufficient number of regularly elected commissioners to constitute a quorum, then the board shall be filled by the elected mayors of incorporated municipalities within Columbus County. If a sufficient number of these mayors are not available under the conditions cited; then the board shall be filled by regularly elected county officers, such as the Sheriff, Clerk of Court, Register of Deeds, etc. If by reasons of the death, absence, physical or mental disability of these county elected officers, then the board shall be filled by appointive officers who are the heads or directors of departments of the County Government. These temporary members of the Board of County Commissioners shall serve until the end of the emergency, or until regular elections can be held, whichever is sooner, except that they shall not be

relieved of their temporary appointment as Commissioner, until or unless, there is a sufficient number of regularly elected Commissioners available for duty.

2. Other County Officers-- In the event of the death, absence, physical or mental disability of any elected or appointed officer, or any department head serving in such capacity in Columbus County; the Board of County Commissioners, as constituted under this resolution, shall appoint a qualified deputy or other qualified person to serve in that office until the return, or the recovery of the regularly elected or appointed officer, or until regular elections have been held to fill elective vacancies when they occur.

3. In the event of the return, in the case of absent officials, or recovery, in the case of ill officials, they shall resume their duties and the temporarily appointed commissioner or county officer shall revert to their status prior to their temporary appointment. Recovery from physical or mental illness shall be certified by the Chief, Columbus County Emergency Medical Service prior to restoration to duty.

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WHEREAS, The general assembly of the State of North Carolina did pass and ratify on the 21st day of April 1959, Chapter 349 of the SESSION LAWS of 1959, a bill designated as: "An act to provide to the continuity of local government in an emergency."

WHEREAS, by this authority is granted the said local governments whenever the governor and council of state, acting together, declare an emergency to exist by reason of actual or impending hostile attack upon the State of North Carolina and due to the emergency so declare it shall become imprudent or impossible to conduct the affairs of county government at the regular or usual place:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: In the event of permanent seat of government at Whiteville, for any reason, becomes untenable, then the government of Columbus County shall be temporarily re-located at Chadbourn. If Chadbourn is untenable also, then the county government shall be temporarily re-located at Tabor City. If Tabor City is untenable, then the temporary seat of government shall be at Fiar Bluff, Lake Waccamaw, or Acme, whichever shall be tenable. If none of the above municipalities or communities are tenable, then the Commissioners may elect any municipality or community within, or without Columbus County as the temporary seat of government.

THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR SHALL:

1. In the event of such re-location and in accordance with instructions of the County Commissioners and the Chairman of the Civil Defense Council of Columbus County, prepare such facilities for use, coordinate transportation and communications, and arrange temporary billeting for the emergency government.

2. He shall inform the emergency services and the citizens of the location of the temporary seat of government and shall effect such coordination and liaison with the State and Federal Governments, and with affected municipalities or communities as may be necessary for the orderly transfer and conduct of government.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Miriam N. Muldrow and Willa V. Easley, Whiteville Township, be segregated so that Miriam N. Muldrow and A. R. Smith may be permitted to pay the taxes for the years 1948 through 1962 on tract #3 (valued for tax purposes for the years 1948 through 1958 at \$110.00, and for the years 1959 through 1962 at \$132.00) in action entitled TOWN OF WHITEVILLE Vs MIRIAM N. MULDROW; WILLA V. EASLEY; E. R. MERRICK, Trustee, N. C. Mutual Life Ins. Company; A. R. SMITH and wife MARGARET SMITH & COLUMBUS COUNTY & LENORA HOWARD. Upon payment of the above taxes for the said years, this tract of land shall be cleared of tax liens for the said years.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of T. J. Baldwin, Welches Creek Township, be accepted at par for the years 1923; 1926 through 1934, and 1936 through 1942.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Belk Hensdale, Whiteville Township, be reduced in value by \$45,686.00 for the year 1962. Through error, their stock of merchandise and fixtures were listed at \$70,391.00 rather than \$24,705.00.

Ordered: that taxes for the years 1961 and 1962 listed in the name of Marshall Smith, South Williams Township, be cancelled. This was for Poll Tax which was listed twice for these years.

Ordered: that Keiver Meares, Cerro Gordo Township, be given a refund of \$3.90. A 1958 Chevrolet Impala which should have been listed at \$860.00 was listed at \$1,060.00 for this year.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Henry Lee Meares, Whiteville Township, be reduced in value by \$1,035.00. A 1958 Impala valued at \$860.00 and a 1953 Plymouth valued at \$175.00 was listed by him and also by his father. (Year 1961)

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Carl Lee Freeman, Waccamaw Township, be cancelled for the years 1961 and 1962. This tax covered Poll only and he had listed for these years in Bolton Township.

Ordered: that taxes for the year 1935 listed in the name of M. V. Hammond, Cerro Gordo Township, be cancelled. This was a double listing.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of J. R. Williamson, Cerro Gordo Township, be cancelled for the years 1932; 1934; and 1935. This was a double listing.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Mrs. T. F. Suggs, Bug Hill Township, be accepted at par for the years 1929, 1930, 1931, 1934, 1935, and 1936. (This tax being paid by Olive M. Suggs, Rt. 3, Tabor City, N. C.)

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Dorothy D. Graham, Western Prong Township, for the year 1962, be reduced in value by \$3,000.00. Through error in copying the abstract, a valuation of \$4,000.00 was used instead of \$1,000.00.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of John Barnes, Ransom Township, for the year 1962, be reduced in value by \$1,000.00. Through error the 29-acre tract of land was valued at \$1,818.00 rather than \$818.00.

Ordered: that B. C. Malpass be allowed to pay taxes listed in the name of T. Willoughby, Ransom Township, for the year 1939 at par.

Ordered: that B. C. Malpass be allowed to pay taxes listed in the name of Casper Willoughby, Ransom Township, for the years 1937, 1938, and 1939, at par.

Ordered: that the Tax Collector be given a release for Poll Tax on Ralph McKoy, Welches Creek Township, for the years 1961 and 1962. This man did not live in Columbus County.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Essie Shaw, Ransom Township, be cancelled for the years 1941 through 1962. This is a 2-acre tract which has been double listed.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Louis William Malpass, Ransom Township, be segregated for the year 1945 so that Herman Malpass may

pay the tax on a 59-acre tract of land valued at \$2,035.00, and on the same percentage of his personal property, and that upon payment of taxes for the above year, this 59-acre tract be free of tax lien for said year.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Miles Brown, Ransom Township, be reduced in value by \$1,000.00 for the years 1960, 1961, and 1962. This was due to an error in copying abstract.

Ordered: that taxes listed in the name of Zemp Leggett, Et Al, Bolton Township, be reduced in value for the year 1962 by \$300.00. This was due to the house being burned in August 1961. This one lot is to be listed in 1963 at \$96.00.

Ordered: that the county accountant forward a check in the amount of \$250.00 to the Chadbourn Fire and Rescue Squadron, and a like amount to the Fair Bluff Rescue Unit.

Ordered: that the chairman and clerk be authorized to sign bond, interest, and redemption fund voucher in the amount of \$1,917.50 to pay the following debt service due:
