Upon motion made and duly seconded, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, ENDORSING FLOOD CONTROL AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS IN WACCAMAW RIVER, NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, Waccamaw River is the southern boundary of Columbus County beginning at the South Carolina state line and running westward to Lake Waccamaw and is the boundary line between Columbus and Brunswick Counties, and is the principal outlet and drainage for the greater portion of Columbus County; and

WHEREAS, periodically floods arise within the river basin and its tributaries in the watershed which seriously damage and curtail the production of agricultural products; and

WHEREAS, it may be feasible to provide improvements for the purpose of alleviating flood damages to valuable agricultural lands in the basin; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are satisfied that construction of facilities or improvements that may be made will be economically justified, and that the County of Columbus, North Carolina, will thereby receive substantial benefits; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, that it go on record endorsing improvements of Waccamaw River or for such reaches of river which adjoin Columbus County as may be found feasible and economically justified by the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Columbus will provide the necessary local cooperation as required for such projects which are constructed under the authority of Public Law 685, 84th Congress;

IMPROVEMENTS IN BUCK CREEK, NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, Buck Creek is a portion of one of the tributaries of  
Waccamaw River finding its way through the southeastern part of Horry  
County, South Carolina, and finding its way into Columbus County near  
Dothan; and

WHEREAS, periodically floods arise within the swamp which  
seriously damage and curtail the production of agricultural products; and

WHEREAS, it may be feasible to provide improvements for the  
purpose of alleviating flood damages to valuable agricultural lands in the  
watershed; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are satisfied that  
construction of facilities or improvements that may be made will be economi-  
cally justified, and that the County of Columbus, North Carolina, will there-  
by receive substantial benefits; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Commissioners  
of Columbus County, North Carolina, that it go on record as endorsing improve-  
ments of Buck Creek as may be found feasible and economically justified by  
the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Columbus will provide  
the necessary local cooperation as required for such projects under the  
authority of Public Law 685, 84th Congress;

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RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS COUNTY,  
NORTH CAROLINA, ENDORSING FLOOD CONTROL AND DRAINAGE  
IMPROVEMENTS IN GAPEWAY SWAMP, COLUMBUS COUNTY, NORTH  
CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, Gapeway Swamp is a tributary of Lumber River and  
passes through Horry County, South Carolina, to the state line. Gapeway  
Swamp enters Columbus County at the North-South Carolina state line 1.9 miles  
south of Fair Bluff and runs east-ward, then southeast, and is the principal  
outlet and drainage from Big Bay in Columbus County to the South Carolina  
line at Fair Bluff; and

WHEREAS, periodically floods arise within the swamp watershed  
which seriously damage and curtail the production of agricultural products;  
and

WHEREAS, it may be feasible to provide improvements for the  
purpose of alleviating flood damage to the valuable agricultural lands in the  
basin; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are satisfied that  
construction of facilities or improvements that may be made are economically  
justified, and that the County of Columbus, North Carolina, will thereby  
receive substantial benefits; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of  
Columbus County, North Carolina, that it go on record as endorsing improve-  
ments of Gapeway Swamp as may be found feasible and economically justified  
by the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Columbus will provide the necessary local cooperation as required for such projects which are constructed under the authority of Public Law 685, 84th Congress;

WHEREAS, it may be feasible to provide improvements for the purpose of alleviating flood damages to valuable agricultural lands in the basins; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are satisfied that construction of facilities or improvements that may be made will be economically justified and that the county of Columbus, North Carolina, will thereby receive substantial benefits; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, that it go on record as endorsing improvements of Lumber River or for such reaches of river which adjoin Columbus County as may be found feasible and economically justified by the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Columbus will provide the necessary local cooperation as required for such projects which are constructed under the authority of Public Law 685, 84th Congress;
