The following business was transacted:

A representative of the Whiteville Police Department and Sheriff Duke discussed with the Board the congested parking areas around the courthouse. The Town of Whiteville agreed to mark parking areas if they were allowed by the county to enforce parking procedures. The Board assured them of their support in this problem but under the condition there would be no parking meters placed in these areas until a survey was made and ownership established of these areas.

A lease and rental agreement between F. L. Tolar and the County of Columbus for a period of one year was presented to the Board. This building is presently being used by the Civil Defense and Commodity Foods Warehouse.

Ordered: that the Chairman sign and execute lease between F. L. Tolar and the County of Columbus for a period of one year.

A letter of resignation from Dewitt T. Gooden was presented to the Board. Mr. Gooden plans to enter graduate school of N. C. State University at Raleigh for the fall semester. The Board accepted this resignation with regret.

Mr. G. Lamont Hinson Representing SENCland Community Action, Inc. discussed with the Board the new program now underway at the center "More Income for Farming Program." This program consists of forty VISTA volunteer workers that will canvas a three county territory

to help organize a co-op and set up a market where all kinds of vegetables can be sold for

a support price. These wolunteer workers will visit small farms and create interest to

attend local meetings to inform the farmers and if enough interest is created a federal grant

will be given this area for the establishment of this market.

Ordered: that Martin Carter be appointed to serve on the Board of Directors to the SENCland Community Action, Inc.

Motion was made by Commissioner Burns and seconded by Commissioner Williamson upon the recommendation of the Columbus County Board of Education the date for the \$4,000,000 School Bond election is set for December 10, 1968.

Attorney James D. Proctor reviewed the transfer of property with the Board of Commissioners and presented a title certificate from George H. Batten. Upon the recommendation of the County Attorney, the Chairman was authorized to execute the transfer of property to George H. Batten upon receipt of deed to the County.

BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED that the County of Columbus convey to George H. Batten a strip of land 24 feet by 68 feet, containing 1632 square feet, at the north end of the property conveyed by Jack Saunders, et ux, upon the conveyance by George H. Batten to Columbus County of a strip of land 16 feet by 102 feet, containing 1632 square feet, and lying immediately north of the Courthouse Annex property conveyed by Annie Memory Spears to Columbus County by deed recorded in Deed Book # 175, page 541.
