The Honomable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office at 10:00 A.M. February 3, 1969 it being first Monday.

The following business was transacted:

The minutes of the January 20th meeting were read and approved.

Ordered: that a check from the Out Door Poor Fund be written
to Ruby Murphy, Evergreen, N. C. in the amount of \$25.00.

Mr. C. D. Raper, County Extension Chairman presented a list of names to the Board from various sections of the county for approval. This group will be the Board of Directors of the Columbus County Agri-Business Association and from this Board an Executive Board and also Board of Trustees will be named. Final approval of this group will be at a later date.

John A. Byrd, Dog Warden, appeared before the Board and discussed His duties and present schedule for vaccination of dogs throughout the county.

Rudolph Walters, Executive Director of the Economic Development Commission appeared at the request of Eskridge & Long Construction Co. to secure a two year option from the County for an additional 15 acre tract of land that adjoins the 15 acres recently purchased from the county by the Whiteville Development Corp. for Eskridge & Long Construction Co. to build a shell building to attract industry into the county, After a lengthy discussion, Mr. Walters was directed to contact Mr. Richard Arp and negotiate with him concerning the release of the above mentioned property. Mr. Arp's lease agreement will expire November 30, 1969.

Ordered: that the resignation of D. D. Barfield as constable for Chadbourn Township be accepted.

Ordered: that Roy Knox Jernigan be appointed constable for Chadbourn Township and that his surety bond be approved.

Ordered: that the Board of County Commissioners finds as a fact

that there is no duly qualified or elected constable serving Bug Hill
Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, and that Foster Jinks Harper
is a man of good character and reputation and has heretofore served the
Bug Hill Township community as a constable and that citizens from the
Bug Hill Township appeared before the Board and requested this appointment.
It is therefore ordered upon motion of W. O. Johnson and duly seconded by
J. Roland Gore and unanimously adopted that Foster Jinks Harper be and
is appointed constable of Bug Hill Township and said Foster Jinks Harper
be appointed to the office of constable upon his posting necessary bonds
and taking the necessary oath of office.

Norman Peal, Chairman of the Board of Elections, appeared and discussed the loose leaf registration system and also stated office space for the Board of Elections must be secured. No action was taken concerning the loose leaf registration system but the chairman was directed to investigate the office formerly rented and negotiate with the owner.

Senator Sankey W. Robinson appeared before the Board and discussed the various bills being introduced into the legislature and recommended a resolution from the Board be adopted and sent to the Governor opposing a tax on tobacco. After a general discussion the following resolution was adopted.

Upon motion made by Commissioner J. Roland Gore, seconded by Commissioner Edward W. Williamson and unanimously adopted, it was resolved as follows:

WHEREAS, the economy of North Carolina is dependent to a great extent upon tobacco and tobacco products; and

WHEREAS, tobacco farmers and related tobacco industries are already experiencing difficulty in production and marketing; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it to be inappropriate for tobacco products to be burdened with a special tax on said products; and

WHEREAS, this Board further deems it to be in the best interest of the people of the State of North Carolina for the production of tobacco products and the sale of tobacco products to be promoted and favored; and

WHEREAS, this Board feels that any new or additional taxes imposed upon tobacco products would be detrimental to the over all economy of the State and particular to the tobacco related industries.

It is therefore RESOLVED, that this Board officially object and oppose the imposition of any new taxes on tobacco products and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Honorable Robert W. Scott, Governor of

the State of North Carolina and to the members of the General Assembly who represent Columbus County and urge all to use their influence to prevent the imposition of any new or additional taxes on tobacco or tobacco products.

Representative R. C. Soles, Jr., stated a bill had not been introduced into the legislature to authorize the Town of Whiteville to convey the airport property to the County because the necessary information from the attorney for the Town of Whiteville had not been received. Mr. Soles assured the Board he would proceed with this bill as soon as all legal documents are received.

Ordered: that the resignation of Robert H. Aranow, Riegelwood, N. C., from the Board of Directors of the Columbus County Economic Development Commission be accepted with regret. The Board of Commissioners wishes to express its appreciation and gratitude to Mr. Aranow for services rendered to the county as a director on the Economic Development Commission. The Chairman was directed to write a letter in behalf of the Board.

Ordered: that the following names be reappointed to the Board of Directors for the Columbus County Economic Development Commission for a three year term.

Mr. E. L. White from the Soil Conservation Department and a delegation of interested persons appeared before the Board and stated that the State Soil & Water Conservation Committee would soon enact a bill in the legislature for state funds to be appropriated to match county funds for the purpose of soil surveys in counties of North Carolina. They ask the Board to use their influence with all members of the General Assembly to help this bill pass. Mr. John Yates spokesman for the group further stated that this is a much needed project for Columbus County. The Board assured the delegation of their support.

Mr. Rhone Anderson and his attorney D. Jack Hooks appeared before the Board and asked that no additional permits for the collection of garbage within a six mile radius of Whiteville be issued by this Board. Mr. Anderson now holds exclusive rights to this area. The Board did not take any action at this time. However, later in the afternoon, after a lengthy discussion, the following resolution was unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS, Edgar Soles has renewed his request for a permit authorizing him to collect garbage within a 6 mile radius of Whiteville; and

WHEREAS, this Board has received petitions from interested citizens and have themselves conducted an independent investigation into the facts and into the necessity for additional garbage collecting in said area; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds as a fact that there has been a change in conditions existing since Mr. Soles applied for a license before the Board on February 5, 1968 which was denied at that time; and

WHEREAS, this Board considers it to be in the best interest of the citizens living within a 6 mile radius to grant an additional garbage collection license and that Mr. Edgar Soles is a fit and proper person to receive said license and permit.

It is now therefore ordered, upon motion of Edward W. Williamson and seconded by T. E. Burns and unanimously adopted that Mr. Edgar Soles be granted a garbage collection permit to cover the area within a 6 mile radius of the City of Whiteville and that in addition thereto the license heretofore granted to Mr. Rhone Anderson shall continue in full force and effect except that said license shall not be exclusive. Neith license of Mr. Anderson or Mr. Soles shall be transferable except by permission of the Board of County Commissioners. This Board further recommends that Mr. Anderson and Mr. Soles attempt to work together so as to serve the citizens of said designated area in the best and most economical manner possible.

The Board of Education met with the Commissioners concerning a Literary Loan for an Administrative Building. Edwarders Williamson, attorney for the Board of Education, stated Literary Loan funds must be used for permanent buildings. The Commissioners reminded the Board of Education that they had approved the Literary Loan in March of 1968 and that the Board of Education should decide whether to build an Administrative Building or whether monies must be secured for the purchase of mobile units for the school year 1969-70. It was decided that the Board of Education should submit a written proposal /the Commissioners concerning the action they wish to be taken.

Ordered: that the real estate valuation listed in the name of Arthur White, Chadbourn Township, be reduced in the amount of \$1,200.00 for the year 1968 due to double listing.

Ordered: that the personal property valuation listed in the name of Franklin D. Larrimore, Chadbourn Township, be reduced in the amount

of \$1,300.00 for the year 1968 due to an error in listing.

Ordered: that the late listing penalty listed in the name of R. C. Applewhite, Jr. Heirs, Ransom Township, be released for the year 1968 due to a misunderstanding when listing.

Ordered: a refund on 1956 taxes, receipt # 2652 in the amount of \$7.78 in the name of Lee McPherson be given due to double listing. These taxes were paid 9-11-68 by J. C. Hobbs and refund is being made to Mr. Mobbs.
