The following business was transacted:

The Chairman declared the Board now sitting as a Board of Equalization and Review with the Tax Supervisor acting as clerk. The following oath was administered by Jewell W. Dunivant, Asst. Clerk of Court:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully discharge my duties as a member of the Board of Equalization and Review of Columbus County, N. C; and I will not allow my actions as a member of said Board to be influenced by personal or political friendship or obligations. This the 8th day of April, 1969."

After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to avoid congestion at the meetings of the Board of Equalization and Review, special meetings will be set up in the communities most affected by revaluation of real estate due to assignment of rights-of-way to the State Highway division. Mr. J. Hubert Norris, Tax Supervisor and Brooks Stanley, Appraisal Worker, will set up a schedule and this information will be published in a local paper for property owners. Each person who has sold land to the state for rights-of-way must present transfer records, including settlement sheets. Property owners who are unable to meet the appraisal worker at the appointed time and place may come to the Tax Supervisor's office.

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The Chairman declared the Board sitting in regular session and the following business was transacted:

Ordered: that a check in the amount of \$25 be written to Rod Nance from the Out Door Poor Fund.

Ordered: that a check in the amount of \$25 be written to Helen Nance from the Out Door Poor Fund.

Ordered: that Sue Stone be paid in the amount of \$50 for tax listing work in January, 1968.

Ordered: that all departments be directed to present budget requests not later than May 5th.

Ordered: that the chairman and clerk be authorized to sign Bond, Interest, & Redemption Fund voucher in the amount of \$11,263.13 to pay the following debt service due May 1, 1969:

Upon motion made by Commissioner Edward W. Williamson and seconded by Commissioner W. O. Johnson, the following resolution recommending that Governor Robert Scott reappoint Carl Meares to the State Highway Commission was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the Honorable Carl W. Meares is an outstanding citizen of Columbus County who has served his county and state in numerous civic and public offices including membership in the North Carolina Senate and as a member of the North Carolina Highway Commission; and

WHEREAS, the said Honorable Carl W. Meares is now serving as a member of the State Highway Commission; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus that the Honorable Robert W. Scott, Governor of the State of North Carolina, will soon reappoint certain members to the State Highway Commission and appoint certain new members to serve on said commission; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of County Commissioners that the Honorable Carl W. Meares be reappointed by the Governor to serve an additional term as a member of the State Highway Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ordered and decreed that this Board does hereby officially endorse the Honorable Carl W. Meares for reappointment to the North Carolina State Highway Commission and the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners is hereby directed to advise the Governor of the action of this Board and to encourage the Honorable Robert W. Scott, Governor of the State of North Carolina, to reappoint Honorable Carl W. Meares to the State Highway Commission.

Mr. Roscoe Jacobs and Mr. Ernest Jacobs appeared before the Board and asked the Commissioners to sign a petition to help them retain Waccamaw Elementary School. Also they requested that a resolution be adopted by this Board concerning the school.

Upon motion made by Commissioner T. E. Burns and seconded by Commissioner Edward W. Williamson, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners that the Columbus County Board of Education has ruled that the Waccamaw School in Columbus County, North Carolina, be closed and that the students who are now attending said school be transferred to other schools in the county; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Waccamaw School Community have given much thought, consideration, study and planning to the advisability of closing the Waccamaw School as recommended by the County Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the Waccamaw School District have concluded that the closing of said school is not in the best interest of their community and the education of their students; and

WHEREAS, they, the citizens of the Waccamaw School Community, have presented considerable evidence to the Board of County Commissioners which indicates to this Board that the Board of Education should reconsider its decision with a view to devising a solution to the problem and a system whereby the Waccamaw School can remain in existence and contribute to the overall well being of the Waccamaw School Community.

NOW, THEREFORE, this Board does hereby officially recommend and request that the Columbus County Board of Education and other appropriate authorities reconsider the order heretofore entered by the Board of Education and attempt to devise a plan whereby said school may remain open for the proper training and education of the school children and citizens of the Waccamaw School Community of Columbus County, North Carolina.

Norman Peal, Chairman of the Board of Elections, appeared before the Board and stated that the bill had passed in the General Assembly that would allow Columbus County and eleven other counties to hold a new registration of qualified voters between April 1, 1969 and September 30, 1969.

Earl Norris, salesman for the News Reporter Co., Inc. appeared and stated the News Reporter Co. carried materials, binders, and cabinets that must be purchased for the new registration. Commissioners stated a decision on the purchasing of these materials would be made in the near future.

The following motion was made by Commissioner J. Roland Gore and seconded by Commissioner W. O. Johnson and unanimously carried and ordered hereinafter set forth to wit:

WHEREAS, Luther Smith heretofore executed a lien to the County of Columbus to secure to the county certain payments to him by the Department

of Public Welfare; and

WHEREAS, the said Luther Smith lien heretofore mentioned is recorded in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Columbus County in APTD Book #1, page 127; and

WHEREAS, R. C. Soles, Jr. County Attorney, has negotiated with the heirs of said Luther Smith and one William McNeill who purchased said lands of Luther Smith, deceased, and have collected the sum of \$200 for the use and benefit of the County in exchange for the county releasing the property hereinafter described from the aforementioned lien; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds as a fact that the foregoing is correct and that the said \$200 represents a fair market value of the property hereinafter described and that the same should be released from the lien executed by Luther Smith which is recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court, Columbus County, North Carolina in APTD Lien Book #1, page 127.

IT IS NOW, THEREFORE, ordered that in consideration of \$200 paid to the County of Columbus by the estate of Luther Smith and the said William McNeill, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has and does hereby release and discharge forever the said APTD Lien as recorded in APTD Book #1, page 127 any and all property hereinafter described. It being the expressed intention of the Board of County Commissioners that all liens on said property with the exception of any county taxes shall be discharged and said property shall be free and clear of all liens.

Said property released from the above mentioned county lien is described as follows:

Lying and being in the Town of Tabor City, N. C. Bounded on the South by lands of Joe Gerald, bounded on the East by lands on Z. B. Lewis, bounded on the North by lands of Z. B. Lewis, bounded on the West by a Street, containing one acre. Being the same land as conveyed by Z. B. Lewis and wife, to Lloyd Gerald and Isabella Gerald, by deed dated February 16, 1938, and filed for registration on the 22nd day of February, 1938.

Being the same land as described in that certain deed from Waccamaw Bank and Trust Company, to Luther Smith, as recorded in Book 161, page 226, Columbus County Registry.

Except the following described lots which were heretofore conveyed by Luther Smith before his death.

(a) Lot conveyed by Luther Smith to Monor H. Dewitt and wife, as recorded in Book 183, page 66, and Correction Deed as recorded in Book 191, page 176, Columbus County Registry.

(b) Deed from Luther Smith and wife, to Von Reaves, as recorded in Book 188, page 406, Columbus County Registry.

For a further and more accurate description of said lot excluding all conveyances before the death of Luther Smith, the same being described as follows:

Beginning at an iron stake on the East side of Grace Street, said beginning corner being the Northwest corner of Ervin Simmons' lot as recorded in Book 248, page 242, Columbus County Registry; thence with the Eastern right of way of Grace Street North 3 degrees 46 minutes West 73.2 feet to an iron stake; thence North 86 degrees 37 minutes East 213 feet to an iron stake; thence South 0 degree 11 minutes East 73.2 feet to an iron stake; thence South 86 degrees 35 minutes West 208.4 feet to the beginning and being shown and delineated on plat prepared by Robert D. Inman, for the Estate of Luther C. Smith, dated August 23, 1968, and recorded in Plat Book 10, page 26, Columbus County Registry.

It is expressly directed that the liens are not to be cancelled but that the property hereinabove described is hereby released from the aforementioned lien and the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court shall be notified of this transaction so that a notation can be made on the records in the Clerk's office.

Representatives of the State Board of Health and State Welfare Department and also county Health officials met with the Board and stated that the Columbus County Jail and the condition of it was one of the worst in the state. They advised the Board not to spend any more money for renovations but to build a new one. The Commissioners were given thirty days to take some action concerning this problem by state officials.

Ordered: that the real estate listed in the name of Lanue Graham, Fair Bluff Township, be cancelled for the years 1966, 1967, and 1968 due to double listing.

Ordered: that the taxes listed in the name of D. W. Franklin Ammons, Williams Township, Be accepted at par for the years 1963 and 1964.

Ordered: that the taxes listed in the name of Joseph A. Todd, Bug Hill Township, be cancelled for the year 1968 due to double listing. (Double listed to Sammy Sellers) .

Ordered: that the taxes listed in the name of Wesley M. Bryant, Ransom Township, be cancelled for the year 1930 due to double listing.

Ordered: that the poll tax listed in the name of Eugene Williams, Williams Township, be released for the year 1968 due to a clerical error.

ROAD PETITION: WACCAMAW TOWNSHIP: This road is known as the Jacobs Road. It is .8 mile in length and has 4 occupied homes located on it.

ROAD PETITION: RANSOM TOWNSHIP: This road branches off SR #1825 and is known as "Thicket Road". It has 5 occupied homes located on it and is 4 miles in length.

ROAD PETITION: RANSOM TOWNSHIP: SR #1740, also known as Hoover Road, has 19 occupied homes located on it and is 2 miles in length.
