The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office October 6, 1969, at 10:00 A.M., it being first Monday.

The following business was transacted:

Upon motion of Commissioner Welliamson, seconded by Commissioner Burns the minutes of the September 15th meeting were approved as read.

Upon motion of Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Williamson, the minutes of the September 20th call meeting were approved as read.

Ordered: that the resignation of Dewey Bowen as Constable of Tatum
Township be accepted.

Ordered: that the surety bond for Edward Britt be approved as Constable for Tatum Township.

Ordered: that a check in the amount of \$225.00 be written to Advancement, Inc. for the county's share of operating expenses for the fiscal year 1969-70.

Ordered: that Columbus County rent office space from S. P. Stanley, Jr. for a full time Employment Security Commission office on a monthly basis at a rate of \$125 per month.

Ordered: that a posting machine be purchased for the Tax Collector's office at an approximate cost of \$6,608.00. A down payment of \$615.56 is with all rental payments to be applied on remaining balance required and a monthly rent of \$191/with the balance due October 1, 1970.

Ordered: that the Chairman be authorized to contact the Chairman of the Bladen County Board of Commissioners and any other officials within Columbus County, for available facilities to accommodate prisoners and also to inquire of the approximate cost to the county in the event the county jail is ordered closed by Commissioner Craig of the Department of Social Services.

Upon motion by Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner
Burns and unanimously adopted that the budget for Columbus County as pertaining

to the funds of the Department off Social Services for the fiscal year 1960-70 is hereby amended to comply with the directives of the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services for the State of North Carolina which requires an additional appropriation in the amount of \$9,237.00.

Upon motion of Commissioner T. E. Burns, seconded by Commissioner Edward W. Williamson, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, a great need exists for a municipal water and sewer system in the Town of Whiteville; and

WHEREAS, the Whiteville Development Corporation has been duly incorporated to provide said services; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Board that Federal funds may be available to assist in the construction of the proposed system.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County approves said project and will cooperate to the fullest extent in the successful conculsion thereof.

Mr, L. D. Worley representing Sencland Community Action, Inc. appeared before the Board and asked for the Board's approval to co-ordinate the listed programs for Sencland for the fiscal year beginning December 1, 1969.

Ordered: that the resignation of James R. Rabon as a member of the Board of Directors of the SEEDC be accepted with regret.

Ordered: that Rudolph Walters, Executive Director of the Columbus County Economic Development Commission be appointed to serve on the Board of Directors of the Southeastern Economic Development Commission. Mr. Walters replaces Mr. James R. Rabon.

Mr. Robert Dale Inman, Register Land Surveyor, stated to the Board that Mr. Wilbur C. Fuller, Director of Division of Geoditis Survey from the North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development, planned to be in Columbus County for approximately three to four weeks to establish additional control monuments. Mr. Fuller is requesting any manual labor to help accelerate this work. The Board authorized Mr. Inman to supply two common labors for the county and to contact the Chairman as to the approximate cost each week.

The Chairman of the Columbus County Board of Education, Mr. Waldo Marlowe, appeared before the Board to discuss school problems. The Board of

of Commissioners stated that they recognized that it was the legal responsibility of the Board of Education to operate the schools and that this Board had not been requested by the Board of Education to meet for any purpose but that this Board is willing to discuss with the Board of Education any problem or if they could be of assistance in any way. The Clerk was then directed to make available for public inspection all minutes of meetings and approved budgets and particularly any information dealing with school appropriations.

Mr. James R. Rabon, Chairman of the Columbus County Housing
Authority, Mr. Rudolph Walters, Executive Director of the Economic Development*
Commission, and Mr. George Woodall representing Sheetz and Bradfield Architests,
appeared before the Board to review the work now underway by the Housing
Authority. Following a thorough discussion of a cooperation agreement between
Columbus County and the Columbus County Housing Authority, Commissioner
W. O. Johnson introduced the following resolution:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Columbus County Housing Authority (herein called the

"Local Authority") and Columbus County (herein called the Municipality")

desire to enter into a Cooperation Agreement in connection with the development

of low-rent housing units pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937

as amended:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County that the Local Authority and the Municipality enter into a Cooperation Agreement and the Chairman is hereby authorized to execute the same on behalf of the Board of Commissioners and the Clerk to attest the same and affix thereto the seal of the County of Columbus, N.C., said Cooperation Agreement being substantially the following form:

COOPERATION AGREEMENT

This Agreement entered into this 6th day of October, 1969 by and between Columbus County Housing Authority (herein called the "Local Authority") and County of Columbus (herein called the "Municipality"), Witnesseth:

In consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do agree as follows:

- 1. Whenever used in this Agreement:
 - (a) The term "Project" shall mean any low-rent housing hereafter developed as an entity by the Local Authority with financial assistance of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA (Herein called the "Govern-

- ment"), excluding, however, any low-rent housing project heretofore covered by any contract for loans and annual contributions.
- (b) The term "Taxing Body" shall mean the State or any political subdivision or taxing unit thereof in which a Project is situated and which would have authority to assess or levy real or personal property taxes or to certify such taxes to a taxing body or public officer to be levied for its use and benefit with respect to a Project if it were not exempt from taxation.
- (c) The term "Shelter Rent" shall mean the total of all charges to all tenants of a Project for dwelling rents and nondwelling rents (excluding all other income of such Project), less the cost to the local Authority of all dwelling and nondwelling utilities.
- (d) The term "Slum" shall mean any area where dwellings predominate which, by reason of dilapidation, overcrowding, faulty arrangement or design, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities or any combination of these factors, are detrimental to safety, health or morals.
- 2. The Local Authority shall endeavor (a) to secure a contract or contracts with the Government for loans and annual contributions covering one or more Projects comprising approximately 1000 units of low-rent housing and (b) to develop and administer such Project or Projects, each of which shall be located within the corporate limits of the Municipality. The obligations of the parties hereto shall apply to each such Project.
- 3. (a) Under the constitution and statutes of the State of North Carolina, all Projects are exempt from all real and personal property taxes levied or imposed by and Taxing Body. With respect to any Project, so long as either (i) such Project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes; or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for loans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such Project remains in force and effect; or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with such Project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality agrees that it will not levy or impose any real or personal property taxes upon such Project or upon the Local Authority with respect thereto. During such period, the Local Authority shall make annual payments (herein called "Payments in Lieu of Taxes") in lieu of such taxes and in payment for the public services and facilities furnished from time to time without other cost or charge for or with respect to such Project.
 - (b) Each such annual Payment in Lieu of Taxes shall be made after the end of the fiscal year established for such Project and shall be in an amount equal to either (i) ten percent (10%) of the Shelter Rent actually collected but in no event to exceed ten percent (10%) of the Shelter Rent charged by the local Authority in respect to such Project during such fiscal year or (ii) the amount permitted to be paid by applicable state law in effect on the date such payment is made, whichever amount is the lower.
 - (c) No payment for any year shall be made to the Municipality in excess of the amount of the real property taxes which would have been paid to the Municipality for such year if the Project were not exempt from taxation.
 - (d) Upon failure of the Local Authority to make any Payment in Lieu of Taxes, no lien against any Project or assets of the Local Authority shall attach, nor shall any interest or penalties accrue or attach on account thereof.

The Municipality agrees that, subsequent to the date of initiation (as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended) of each Project and within five years after the completion thereof, or such further period as may be approved by the Government, there has been or will be elimination (as approved by the Government) by demolition, condemnation, effective closing, or compulsory repair or improvement, of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units situated in the locality or metropolitan area in which such Project is located, substantially equal in number to the number of newly constructed dwelling untis provided by such Project; Provided, That, where more than one family is living in an unsafe or insanitary dwelling unit, the elimination of such unit shall count as the elimination of units equal to the number of families accommodated therein; and Provided, further, That this paragraph 4 shall not apply in the case of (i) any Project developed on the site of a Slum cleared subsquent to July 15, 1949, and that the dwelling units eliminated by the clearance of the site of such Project shall not be counted as elimination for any other Project or any other low-rent housing project, or (ii) any Project located in a rural nonfarm area.

During the period commencing with the date of the acquisition of any part of the site or sites of any Project and continuing so long as either (i) such Project is owned by a public body or governmental agency and is used for low-rent housing purposes, or (ii) any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for leans or annual contributions, or both, in connection with such Project remains inforce and effect, or (iii) any bonds issued in connection with such Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with such Project remain unpaid, whichever period is the longest, the Municipality without cost or charge to the Local Authority or the tenants of such Project (other than the Payments in Lieu of Taxes) shall:

- 5. (a) Furnish or cause to be furnished to the Local Authority and the tenants of such Project public services and facilities of the same character and to the same extent as are furnished from time to time without cost or change to other dwellings and inhabitants in the Municipality;
 - (b) Vacate such streets, roads and alleys within the area of such Project as may be necessary in the development thereof, and convey without charge to the Local Authority such interest as the Municipality may have in such vacated areas; and insofar as it is lawfully able to do so without cost or expense to the Local Authority or to the Municipality, cause to be removed from such vacated areas, insofar as it may be necessary, all public or private utility lines and equipment;
 - (c) Insofar as the Municipality may lawfully do so, (i) grant such deviations from the building code of the Municipality as are reasonable and necessary to promote economy and efficiency in the development and administration of such Project, and at the same time safeguard health and safety, and (ii) make such changes in any zoning of the site and surrounding territory of such Project as are reasonable and necessary for the development and protection of such Project and surrounding territory;
 - (d) Accept grants of easements necessary for the development of such Project; and
 - (e) Cooperate with the Local Authority by such other lawful action or ways as the Municipality and the Local Authority may find necessary in connection with the development and administration of such Project.

- 6. In respect to any Project the Municipality futher agrees that within a reasonable time after receipt of a written request therefor from the Local Authority:
 - (a) It will accept the dedication of all interior streets, roads, alleys, and adjacent sidewalks within the area of such Project, together with all storm and sanitary sewer mains in such dedicated areas, after the Local Authority, at its own expense, has completed the grading, improvement, pavings, and installation thereof in accordance with specifications acceptable to the Municipality;
 - (b) It will accept necessary dedications of land, for and will grade, improve, pave, and provide sidewalks for, all streets bounding such Project or necessary to provide adequate access thereto (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned); and
 - (c) It will provide, or cause to be provided, water mains, and storm and sanitary sewer mains, leading to such Project and serving the bounding streets thereof (in consideration whereof the Local Authority shall pay to the Municipality such amount as would be assessed against the Project site for such work if such site were privately owned.)
- 7. If by reason of the Municipality's failure or refusal to furnish or cause to be furnished any public services or facilities which it has agreed hereunder to furnish or to cause to be furnished to the Local Authority or to the tenants of any Project, the Local Authority incurs any expense to obtain such services or facilities then the Local Authority may deduct the amount of such expense from any Payments in Lieu of Taxes or to become due to the Municipality in respect to any Project or any other low-rent housing projects owned or operated by the Local Authority.
- 8. No. Cooperation Agreement heretofore entered into between the Municipality and the Local Authority shall be construed to apply to any Project covered by this Agreement.
- 9. So long as any contract between the Local Authority and the Government for loans (including preliminary loans) or annual contributions, or both, in connection with any Project remains in force and effect, or so long as any bonds issued in connection with any Project or any monies due to the Government in connection with any Project remain unpaid, this Agreement shall not be abrogated, changed, or modified with out the consent of the Government. The privileges and obligations of the Municipality hereunder shall remain in full force and effect with respect to each Project so long as the beneficial title to such Project is held by the Local Authority or by any other public body or governmental agency, including the Government, authorized by law to engage in the development or administration of low-rent housing projects.

If at any time the beneficial title to, or possession of, any Project is held by such other public body or governmental agency, including the Government, the provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and may be enforced by, such other public body or governmental agency, including the Government.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Municipality and the Local Authority have respectively signed this Agreement and caused their seals to be affixed and attested as of the day and year first above written.

Following a discussion of the application for low-rent housing the following resolution was introduced by Commissioner T. E. Burns read in full and considered:

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR LOW-RENT HOUSING

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA (Herein call the Government") is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects and financial assistance in providing low-rent housing by leasing dwelling units in existing privately-owned structures, that will assist in meeting this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality

involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus County Housing Authority (herein called the "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for low-rent housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Columbus as follows:

- There exists in the County of Columbus a need for such low-rent housing at rents within the means of low-income families.
- 2. The application of the Local Authority to the Government for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$400,000 for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects of not to exceed approximately 1000 dwelling units is hereby approved.

Commissioner Williamson moved that all rules of the Board of
Commissioners of Columbus County which, unless suspended, would prevent the
final passage and adoption of said Resolution at this meeting be and the same
are hereby suspended for the purpose of permitting the consideration, adoption,
and final passage of said Resolution at this meeting and that unanimous consent
of all members present be given for the immediate consideration of said
Resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gore. The question
being put as to the adoption of said motion, the suspension of such rules
and the giving of unanimous consent to the consideration thereof, the roll
was called with the following result:
