The minutes of the May 18th meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Autry Dawsey, Dawsey Homes, Inc. appeared before the Board to inquire about county funds to meet medicaid bills for Columbus County in June. Mr. Dawsey stated the Medicaid program owed him a considerable amount of money for services rendered to Boarding Home patients. The Board stated they had paid bills for the county through April and \$9685 on May bills. Mrs. Alice Wright, Director of Social Services, was also present to answer questions. The Board made no commitments for June bills.

The Columbus County Drug Assoc. with Dr. H. G. Dameron as spokesman for the group, discussed with the Board the Medicaid Program in Columbus County and asked if the county would meet June bills. The Board stated they had budgeted funds termed by the state office as adequate and were not able at this time to commit additional funds for the Medicaid Fund.

Ordered: that a check in the amount of \$3,000 he paid to the N. C. Department of Local Affairs for the zoning of Columbus County.

Upon motion of Commissioner Gore, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, and unanimously adopted that the clerk be directed to call Mr. John J. Hicks, Supt. of County Schools, and request him to resubmit a school budget request for the fiscal year 1970-71 using \$132,000,000 at a collection rate of \$86 % with the same levy of \$1.0230 as 1969-70 levy.

Mr. J. E. Rasdale and members of the Tabor City Rescue Squad appeared before the Board and requested that two radios be purchased for the Tabor City Rescue Unit. Mr. Rasdale stated the numerous calls answered each month by this unit and expressed the importance of being able to contact Sheriff Dept. officials and also Horry County Ambulance Service when an emergency arises. It was also requested that the donations given each year by the County be raised to \$1,000 or that the money be distributed on a pro rate basis according to the number of calls handled per year. Commissioners stated these requests would be considered.

Mr. Timothy Wood, Director of Planning for New Hanover County and Mr. W. E. McDougle, Youpon Beach, N. C., appeared before the Board to discuss Columbus County joining the Lower Cape Fear Council of Local Governments which is now composed of New Hanover and Brunswick Counties and their municipalities. New Hanover, Brunswick, Pender and Columbus County have been

recently designated as a Multi-planning and Development Region by the State Planning Division. The Chairman stated a decision would be made on third Monday whether Columbus County would join this organization.
