

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office at 10:00 A.M., Tuesday, September 8, 1970, Monday, being a legal holiday.

The following business was transacted:

The minutes of the August 17th meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion of Commissioner Edward W. Williamson, seconded by Commissioner W. O. Johnson, and unanimously adopted that the new county jail building be located on the county farm property west of the present courthouse site on an exact site location to be hereafter determined by the architect and this Board.

A letter of resignation from Betty S. Williamson, County Auditor and Clerk to the Board, was presented to the Board, effective September 15, 1970.

Upon motion of Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Gore, that this resignation be accepted with regret.

Upon motion of Commissioner Burns, seconded by Commissioner Gore, that the following resolution be unanimously adopted:

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING WORKING RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN THE SOUTHEASTERN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION AND THE CAPE FEAR COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Economic Development Commission was created as a joint effort by the counties of Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Cumberland, Hoke, New Hanover, Pender, Robeson, Sampson and Scotland to foster economic development within the ten-county district; and

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Economic Development Commission has prepared a work program and is implementing portions of it relating to economic development within the ten-county district; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Council of Governments was established to coordinate comprehensive planning for growth and development within the counties of Brunswick and New Hanover; and

WHEREAS, Governor Scott, by Executive Order No. Three, dated May 7, 1970, has designated the counties of Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender and Columbus as a single planning district; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Council of Governments has indicated its willingness to undertake comprehensive planning activities related to growth

and development for the planning district composed of Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender and Columbus Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Council of Governments has initiated preparation of an "Overall Program Design" intended to establish a long-range work program for the council related to development within the counties of Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender and Columbus,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:

1. That the Southeastern Economic Development Commission is vital to the continued economic development of the entire ten-county district and is encouraged to continue economic development activities in behalf of the district;

2. That the planning function of the Cape Fear Council of Governments is equally vital to the sound future growth and developments of Brunswick, Columbus, Pender and New Hanover Counties, and the Council is encouraged to continue its activities in this regard; and

3. That the Southwestern Economic Development Commission and the Cape Fear Council of Governments work harmoniously within the State and Federal guidelines established for the operation of each agency respectively - without duplication of effort - so that maximum effective development may be achieved for the entire region.

4. That the executive directors and/or Chairman of the two organization serve in liaison capacity as resource persons to promote co-operation and avoid duplication of efforts.

5. Provide for interchanging of statistical and other factual information relating to industrial development as is available to the two agencies.

Upon motion of Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner Johnson that the following resolution be unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, Archie Toon heretofore executed a lien to the County of Columbus to secure to the County certain payments to him by the Department of Public Welfare; and

WHEREAS, the said Archie Toon lien heretofore mentioned is recorded in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Columbus County in APTD Book # 1, page 80; and

WHEREAS, certain property hereinafter described which is now or heretofore has been owned by Archie Toon has a fair market value of \$800; and

WHEREAS, R. C. Soles, Jr., County Attorney, has negotiated with the said Archie Toon and has collected the sum of \$800 for the County of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, the said Archie Toon and the County Attorney have requested that the said property hereinafter described be released from the said APTD lien as recorded in Lien Book # 1, Page 80, upon payment to the County of Columbus, the said sum of \$800 which represents the fair market value of said property heretofore owned by Archie Toon; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds as a fact that the foregoing is correct and that the said \$800 represents and is a fair market value of the property hereinafter described heretofore owned by the said Archie Toon.

IT IS NOW THEREFORE ordered, that in consideration of the sum of \$800 paid to the County of Columbus, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said property hereinafter described shall be and is now and forever hereafter released and discharged from APTD Lien as recorded in APTD Book # 1, page 80, and any and all other APTD or Welfare liens now held by the County of

Columbus on said property whether the same be expressly hereinafter referred to or not, it being the expressed intention of the Board of Commissioners that all county liens on all said property with the exception of any county taxes due, shall be discharged from said property.

The said property released from the abovementioned county lien or liens is described as follows:

BEGINNING at a concrete monument on the 50 foot right of way line of 130 highway South 28 degrees 08 minutes East 170.50 feet to an iron pipe the Southwest corner of 0.5 acre lot; thence with the western line of said lot North 61 degrees 52 minutes East 214.4 feet to an iron pipe in a branch; thence South 28 degrees 08 minutes East 101.0 feet to an iron pipe in said branch; thence south 61 degrees 52 minutes 215.50 feet to an iron pipe on the 50 foot right of way line of 130 highway; thence with the right of way of highway 28 degrees 08 minutes East 247.20 feet to an iron pipe on the line of Sledge Lumber Company; thence with the old marked line of Sledge Lumber Company North 38 degrees 33 minutes East 573.0 to a concrete monument; thence continuing with Sledge Lumber Company South 74 degrees 36 minutes West 212.97 feet to concrete monument; thence with North line of Sledge Lumber Company North 47 degrees 22 minutes West 103.15 feet to a stake; thence continuing still with Sledge Lumber Company North 81 degrees 40 minutes West 38.10 feet to an iron pipe in Mill Branch; thence with run of said branch South 35 degrees 43 minutes West 97.90 feet to an iron pipe; thence South 64 degrees 02 minutes West 71.30 feet to an iron pipe in said Mill Branch; thence continuing with said branch North 84 degrees 50 minutes West 67.20 feet to concrete monument and the beginning corner; being 3.90 acres being 1/2 of said division of Elizabeth Braxton according to estimated value. Original tract recorded in Book 197 plate 67 Columbus County Registry, Map of Division, Recorded on Book 10 page 125, Columbus County.

It is expressly directed that the liens are not to be cancelled but that the property hereinabove described be released therefrom and that the office of the Clerk of Superior Court shall be notified of this action so that a notification may be made on the records.

Upon motion of Commissioner T. E. Burns, seconded by Commissioner W. O. Johnson, that the following resolution be unanimously adopted:
