The following business was transacted:

The minutes of the meetings of October 5th and October 16th were read and approved.

Ordered: that a check for \$10.00 be sent to Caswell Training School to help defray the expense of a Christmas Party.

Ordered: that the resignation of R. Brooks Stanley as enforcement officer for Southeastern Community College Zoning Area be accepted with regrets. It is further ordered that Robert L. Duncan, Lake Waccamaw, N. C. be appointed to this position.

A group of interested citizens from the Friar Swamp area, and Mr. J. L. Blackman, of Blackman & Associates, came before the Board to discuss the plans for establishing a Friar Swamp Drainage District. The purpose of coming before the Board was to request a loan of \$5,000. from the County to help finance the establishing of the Drainage District. The loan would be repaid within two years. No action was taken at this time.

Five citizens from Welches Creek Township - Mr. E. J. Elkins, Seth Duncan, Jack Brown, Carlyle Batten, and Oscar Batten - came to request a Deputy Sheriff be located in their community. Chairman Watts stated this was under the authority of the Sheriff's Dept. and not the Commissioners decision. Sheriff Duke was not available at this time to discuss this matter.

The Board requested Mr. Walters, Director of Economic Development Commission, to submit the necessary papers to Advancement, Inc. as soon as possible asking for grants for the proposed projects for solid waste disposal and paving the county airport. All Commissioners agreed this is an urgent request.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AND URGING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A COSTAL CORRIDOR HIGHWAY THROUGH NORTH AND SOUTH CAROLINA FROM NORFOLK, VIRGINIA TO AN INTERSECTION WITH INTERSTATE 95 NORTH OF SAVANNAH, GEORGIA.

WHEREAS, there has been proposed a Costal Corridor Highway through North Carolina and South Carolina from Norfolk, Virginia to an intersection with Interstate 95 north of Savannah, Georgia, and;

WHEREAS, the construction of this proposed highway would serve the North Carolina Costal Counties of Bertie, Perquimans, Camden, Martin, Beaufort, Pitt, Greene, Craven, Carteret, Pamlico, Lenoir, Jones, Onslow, Duplin, Pender, Columbus, New Hanover, and Brunswick, and;

WHEREAS, the South Carolina counties of Marion, Horry, Williamsburg, Georgetown, Berkley, Dochester, Charleston, Colleton, Beaufort, and Jasper, and;

WHEREAS, it would serve the terminal area (north) of Tidewater Virginia, Hampton Roads, Delmarva and the Megalopolis of the Northeast United States and the terminal area (south) of Costal Georgia and the State of Florida, and;

WHEREAS, the Costal Area of Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina possesses a vast potential for economic growth in adequate highways are developed, and;

WHEREAS, the economic development of this area is of vital concern to the whole Eastern part of the United States to stem the tide of out migration by providing opportunities for the citizens in this area to make a decent living and therefore stay in the region creating even greater Social, Economic, and Environmental problems in those areas.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners that Congress and the Department of Transportation be requested to construct a Costal Corridor Highway through the region.

A RESOLUTION TO URGE CITIZENS OF COLUMBUS COUNTY TO EXERCISE THEIR RIGHT TO VOTE ON ELECTION DAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1970, AND A RESOLUTION DECLARING SAID DATE A LEGAL HOLIDAY FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

Whereas, this Board of County Commissioners deems it appropriate that they encourage all citizens of Columbus County to exercise their lawful right to vote, and;

WHEREAS, in the United States, the State of North Carolina, and the County of Columbus, the governing bodies and other public officials are elected by popular vote of the people, and;

WHEREAS, the right to vote is one of the freedoms which should be defended and preserved in a democratic society,

NOW THEREFORE, this Board does hereby officially encourage all citizens of Columbus County to go to the polls and vote for the candidates of their choice on Election Day, Tuesday, November 3, 1970, and in the furtherance of the desire of this Board to encourage the citizens to exercise their voting right this Board does hereby declare Tuesday, November 3, 1970, as a legal holiday for all county offices are to be closed on said day.

Done this the 2nd day of November 1970 at the Columbus County Courthouse in Whiteville.

The foregoing resolution was jointly submitted by all members of the Board and unanimously adopted and approved.

It was ordered that the contract be awarded to Farmers Oil & Fertilizer Co., Inc. for the period beginning November 1, 1970, and ending October 31, 1972.

There was a joint discussion with members of the Library Board, Supt. Hicks and Attorney E. L. Williamson, and the Board of Commissioners concerning the property to be conveyed to the Board of Education. Miss Alice Lowe, of the Library Board, made formal objections to the present plans and requested more land be reserved for Library use in the future. After an agreement was reached between all concerned the following motion was passed:

A motion was made by Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, and unanimously adopted that the tract of land shown on a sketch prepared by the Board of Education, designated as 8.96 acres tract be conveyed by Columbus County to the Board of Education with the following changes:

1. That the North & South line of said property be decreased by fifty (50) feet so as to increase the Library tract by fifty(50) feet.
2. That the North-West line, which is joint line of the Library property be altered so as to increase the Library property by fifty(50) feet.
3. That the deed is to include a reverter clause to convey said property back to Columbus County if:

- A. the Board of Education has not started construction of the proposed educational building within one year from the date of this deed, or
- B. said property ceases to be used for educational purposes.

The Board of Education is to allow the Library employees and patrons the use parking facilities provided by the Board of Education at no cost to the Library.

A further motion was made, seconded, and unanimously passed to authorize Chairman Watts to sign the deed conveying said property to the Board of Education when same is approved by the County Attorney.

Ordered: that the following copy of the 1970 tax charge to the Tax Collector be incorporated into the minutes of this meeting.




