Hospital to a private business. The Board stated that they and the citizens of Columbus County
were proud of the hospital and thaught it was a sound business and did not wish to sell it at
this time.

Colonel Walters discussed the progress/the Economic Development Commission mince he had been in Columbus County as Director in 1968. He stated that the County had been prepared for industry to come into the County by installing water & sewer systems, improving the airport, preparing a shell building, etc. At this time, he asked the County to sell five acres of land to the Whiteville Development Corporation for an industrial site to be located near the shell building. A motion was made by Commissioner Gore, seconded by Commissioner Watts, and duly passed to sell five acres of land to the Whiteville Development Corporation for \$1,000 per acre to be used as an industrial site.

Ordered: that the office of the Economic Development Commission be moved into the building known as the New York Cafe, now being remodeled by the Whiteville Chamber of Commerce to be used as office space.

Ordered: that Mr. Leo Mercer be reappointed to the Southeastern Economic Development Commission to serve another term.

Ordered: that tax listers be paid 30% for each correct crop report which has been previously 15¢. The State has increased its payment to the counties.

Ordered: that Edward W. Williamson, A. L. "Ben" Duke, and Emogene W. Suggs be authorized to sign cards in order for Williams & Associates to be able to obtain security keys for the Law Enforcement Center of Columbus County.

Ordered: that J. Hubert Norris be authorized to buy a lawn mower to be used at the County Hall. The Social Services will pay their share for use of the mower.

Ordered: that checks be written/to the following people in the amount of \$25.00 each:

Mrs. Grace Miller, Mrs. Joyce Nobles, and Mrs. Gordan Batten.

Ordered: that the following be appointed as Special Deputies upon meeting the requirements of House Bill #278 which authorizes Columbus County to appoint special deputies:

A motion was made by Commissioner Watts, seconded by Commissioner Burns, and duly passed that the County of Columbus shall pay the N. C. Employees' Retirement System for conducting a pre-valuation regarding retirement program for employees of Columbus County. Said cost of pre-valuation study to be in the amount of \$90.00 plus \$4.00 for each employee concerned.

Mr. George Vaughn from the Fayetteville office of the N. C. Division of Community Planning brought the proposed amendments for zoning Columbus County for the Commissioners to review with their attorney and the attorney for the Planning Board for two weeks, at which time the Planning Board will ask the Commissioners to approve the plan.

Mr. Beverley Paul, Director of the Cape Fear Council of Geovenments, came to discuss the possibility of Columbus County receiving help through the Council of Governments for funding the Law Enforcement Center. The Board had been informed earlier that due to the fact that taxes had been levied to build a jail the Council of Governments could not provide any funds to aid in the construction of the jail. Mr. Paul disagreed with this decision and will contact the Attorney General for a ruling on this matter.

Mr. C. D. Raper made a report to the Board on the farming industry in Columbus County for 1970. He stated farming is still the largest income producer in the County. This year Columbus County and Bladen County are jointly setting up a program, through federal funds, to advise farmers about the correct use of poisons on tobacco crops. There will be scouts monitoring farms that wish to participate and advise the farmers on when and how to effectively treat crops.

Dr. Eugene Douglas, John McKee, and Cecil Brown from Southeastern Regional Mental Health Center in Lumberton came to get a statement of intentions from the Board as to their plans for participating in the mental health program in Lumberton next fiscal year. Dr. Douglas stated the plans are to continue on the present level for next year, which he feels is adequate at this time. The Board will consider the request and give an answear at the May 3rd meeting.

Mr. Crowell Black came before the Board and ask the Board to pass a resolution prohibiting self-service unattended gas stations in Columbus County. Upon the advise of the County Attorney the Board will look into this matter further before taking any action.

Ordered: that Chairman Edward W. Williamson be authorized to execute contracts for the construction of the Columbus County Law Enforcement Center in accordance with the bids heretofore accepted by this Board.

Ordered: that funds be transferred from the ADC Fund to pay the balance due on the Medicaid Draft for May expenditures.

Mrs. Alice Wright, Social Services Director, came to discuss the Public Assistance Budget for 1971-72. The Board advised Mr. Wright to not submitt a tenative budget for the Medicaid Program at this time.

## CONTRACT AGREEMENT FOR THE STATE ATD TO LOCAL AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT

This agreement made and entered into this 22nd day of March 1971 by and between the State of North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development, hereinaster called the Department of Conservation & Development, party of the effirst part, and the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, party of the second part;

## WITTNESSETH:

That Whereas, the Columbus County Board of Commissioners has made a formal application to the N. C. Department of Conservation and Development for State financial aid for airport development and maintenance, and

Whereas, the N. C. Department of Conservation & Development, acting in accordance with House Bill N. 296 of 1967 session laws of the State of N. C., has reviewed the aforesaid application and at a board meeting held in Columbus County on the 5th day of April 1971 approved a grant in the amount of \$50,000.00 which represents 17.22% of the total estimated construction cost as described on the application.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties do mutally agree as follows:

- 1. That the Columbus County Board of Commissioners shall commemce the described construction within 180 days from the date of this contract.
- 2. That the Department of Conservation & Development will issue its voucher in the amount of \$50,000.00 or a lesser amount not to exceex 25% of the latest revised estimated construction.costs.
- 3. That The Columbus County Board of Commissioners shall permit free acess to its accounts and records by official representatives of the State of N. C. for the purpose of such audit or determination is needed to insure compliance with the authorizing act.
- 4. That if the Columbus County Board of Commissioners shall have expended an amount less than stated in the latest revised accepted application, reimbursement will be made to the N. C. Department of Conservation & Development in an amount equal to the excess of 25% of the actual approved and accepted cost.
- 5. That the Columbus County Board of Commissioners agreen that in the event the approved project is not commenced within the prescribed time period, that this contract shall become null and void unless a subsequent extension period is granted by the Department of Conservation & Development. Any State funds obligated to this project shall revert to an unencumbered balance upon the dissolution of this agreement.
- 6. That the Columbus County Board of Commissioners will cause the expenditure of State funds granted under this agreement to be made for the purpose for which the application stated and that due and sufficient notice will be given to N. C. Department of Conservation & Development, prior to any change in the terms of the approved application.
