While I am conscious of the law in regard to re-apportionment, and relize that re-apportionment will be necessary in the future, there has been no demand by the citizens of this County for re-apportionment until now, and since the date for filing for County Commissioner has already begun and some candidates have already filed, I feel that it would be for the best interest of all concerned - the candidates and the citizens of our County-to postpone the final consideration of re-districting until at least two months after the general election as there are many ways in which re-apportionment can be done:

Changing of Districts under the present Zones

County-wide elections of all Commissioners

Election only from separate zones or districts therefore, this is something that should be very seriously considered and not acted upon hastily.

Therefore, Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board of County Commissioners postpone the final consideration until February 1973, and that a committee of 5 be appointed by this Board to study all avenues of re-apportionment and to make a recommendation to the County Board of Commissioners as to the action they deem to be the best interest of all the citizens of Columbus County.
