The following business was transacted:

Mr Beverley Paul, Executive Director of C. O. G., presented a plan that could be used by Columbus County in implementing the Solid Waste Disposal Program in Columbus County. After a discussion with several other interested departments, a motion was made by Commissioner Watts, seconded by Commissioner Johnson and unanimously passed that the plan be presented to the State Department of Health as the plan for Columbus County. It is understood that the plan can be changed if the Board so desires between this presentation ant 1974, . when the plan has to be implemented.

Mr. Paul also presented a Land Use and Transportation Study that is required by the Federal Government to be used by counties in long range planning of land use. The Board acknowledged and endorsed the Plan to be used in regional planning by Region "O", which includes Columbus County.

The following resolution was unanimously passed by the Board upon motion by Commissioner Burns, seconded by Commissioner Johnson:

> JOINT RESOLUTION SUPPORTING APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATION AS <u>LEAD</u> REGIONAL ORGANIZATION

WHEREAS, the Governor declared on May 11, 1971, that one legally constituted organization will be designated as the LEAD regional organization in each of the 17 multicounty regions in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, such LEAD regional organization will be expected to provide leadership doe effective regional planning and for program implementation; and

WHEREAS, such LEAD regional organization must be created by general purpose

local governments and must have its membership open to all general purpose local governments within its region; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Council of Governments meets all of the above descriptions and stipulation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the County of Columbus joins with such other municipalities and counties in this multi-county planning region as may pass this resolution in support of the designation of Cape Fear Council of Governments as the LEAD regional organization in multi-county planning Region "0".

The following people came before the Board in interest of having a soil survey

made in Columbus County; Mr. Yates, local office of Soil Conservation; Mr. Raper, County Extension Chairman; Mr. Clark, F.H.'A.' Official; Mr. Buckwell, State Asst. Soil Scientist; & Mr. Curle, Soil Scientist from Robeson County. Mr. Buckwell stated two alternatives that could be used as a way of determining the cost to Columbus County should they decide to make such a survey; (1) a cost of about \$120,000 which would be determined on a per acre basis and (2) pay a Soil Scientist for the entire time of the survey which would be about five or six years. This cost is estimated to be \$75,000. No decision was made at this meeting. 56î

Budgets were presented by the following departments: Social Services; College; Health Department; Forest Service; & Board of Education. No decisons were made on any Budgets.

Ordered: that E.<sup>4</sup> W.<sup>4</sup> Williamson & T. E. Burns be appointed on the Board at the Cape Fear Council of Governments to replace H. J. Watts and W. O. Johnson at the expiration of their term on June 30, 1972.

Ordered: that the Accountant be authorized to transfer funds from the General County Fund to the Jail Construction Fund to pay the balance due on all Jail Contracts which are to be paid May 22, 1972.

A motion was made by Commissioner Gore, seconded by Commissioner Watts, and unanimously passed that the Tax Collector be relieved of the duty of collecting taxes over ten years old, in accordance with G. S. 105-378 which becomes effective July 1, 1972.

Ordered: that the following taxes be released upon the recommendation of the Tax Supervisor's Office:

Taxes listed in the name of Williams N. Fipps, South Williams Township, be cancelled for the years 1970 and 1971 due to double listing.

Ordered: that a letter be written to Mr Frank Lewis of the Association of . . . County Commissoners informing him that Columbus County does not wish to NACo at this time.

Ordered: that the County purchase a set of G. S. for the Law Enforcement Center Building to be placed in the Magistrates! Office and paid out of the Facilities

Fees from the Clerk of Court.

Ordered: that the week of May 22nd be designated as Senior Citizens Week in Columbus County.

Mrs. Sibyl Geary appeared before the Board to inform them of the results of the application made for funds from DDSA to support the Day Care Center in Columbus County. The reply from Anne F. Wolfe, M.D., M.P.H., Department of Human Resources, Raleigh, N. C. stated that this could not be done in keeping with federal regulations. No plan was adopted at this meeting but will be decided later. Ordered: that the follwoing general county bills be allowed and paid:
