

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office at 10:00a.m., October 7, 1974, it being first Monday.

The meeting was called to order and the following business was transacted:

Ordered: that Hugh Clark and Paul Hughes make a list of needed repairs at the FHA Building and get an estimated cost on making the repairs to present to the Board for consideration at the next meeting.

Ordered: that, upon the assurance from Mrs. Bible as spokesman for the Library Board, an appropriation be made for a branch library at Fair Bluff in the amount of \$5,700.00. Of this sum, \$3,200 is to be spent in establishing the library and \$2,500 is to be used for operation of the library after January 1, 1975.

Ordered: that the County Attorney proceed to obtain an option on the property known as the Baldwin Property, owned by J. R. Bennett, et al, to be used for a Day Care Center and to apply for having the property rezoned. The amount of \$100.00 to be paid for the option is to be applied on the purchase price of \$60,000.

Ordered: that the County Offices within the Courthouse be colsed for Election Day.

Ordered: that Johnie Powell assume the duties of the cleaning contractor ft the X ASC Office to clean their portion of the building for the sum of 162.50 per month. This amount is to be deposited in the General Fund to be applied to the purchase of supplies and Mr. Powell's salary.

Mr. Mills, District Supvr., DOT, came to discuss the location of certain containers that are placed on the State's rights-of-way. He requested a map showing the location of each container and together with Mr. Rhone Anderson, work out a solution to the problem.

Ordered: that a check for \$2,000.00 be given to the Brunswick Rescue Squad.

ROAD PETITION: Road known as the Dale Road, located in Ransom Township. Request that the road be added to the State System.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER V OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS COUNTY

WHEREAS, on April 8, 1974, the North Carolina General Assembly did ratify and enact, by votes of 103 to 3, and 39 to 3, Chapter 1222 of the Session Laws of N. C.; and

WHEREAS, this act amends Chapter V of the Constitution of the State of North Carolina so as to authorize the issuance of Revenue Bonds to finance industrial facilities, including pollution control facilities; and

WHEREAS, this act provides that the amendment is to be submitted to the qualified voters of the State of North Carolina on November 5, 1974, in the form that will allow a vote

for or against . . ."constitutional amendment to create jobs and employment opportunities and to protect the enviroment by auhtorizing the issuance of Revenue Bonds to finance industrial and pollution control facilities . . ."; and

WHEREAS, this method of financing is now availalbe to industry in forty-eight of fifty states; and

WHEREAS, the cost of adequate treatment to all types of pollution discharges continues to increase on a daily basis, and as Industrial Revenue Bond financing has become a widely respected and established method of obtaining funds at attractive interest rates and on an attractive term of payment; and

WHEREAS, this method of financing is not available to the citizens of North Carolina's existing manufacturing community; and North Carolina's Communities are not able to choose whether or not they will offer prospective or existing employers the method of financing existing in surrounding states; and

WHEREAS, these conditions represent an intolerable competitive disadvantage to North Carolina industry and to North Carolina communities who want to do this type of financing; and

WHEREAS, The North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, at their annual meeting in August of 1974, did adopt a resolution endorsing this change to the North Carolina constitution; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Columbus County Board of Commissioners do endorse and support the pending Amendment to Chapter V of the North Carolina Constitution.

RESOLUTION CONCERNING PREPARATION OF A 201 FACILITIES PLAN FOR THE RIEGELWOOD SANITARY DISTRICT SERVICE AREA

WHEREAS, the Riegelwood community does not presently have a central wastewater collection and treatment system, and as a result, is faced with a growing pollution, health and sanitation problem from existing septic tank sewage disposal systems; and

WHEREAS, the Riegelwood Sanitary District proposes to undertake prepatation of a 201 Facilities Plan as a first step toward resolution of the aforementioned problem;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that

1. The Columbus County Board of Commissioners concurs in the need for improving wastewater disposal facilities in the Riegelwood community area.
2. The Commission feels that any efforts to find a solution to the problem can best be undertaken by the Riegelwood Sanitary District and agrees that that Body should act as the "Lead Agency" to have a 201 Facilities Plan prepared as a necessary first step toward resolving the problem.
3. The Commission will cooperate and assist in any way it can to insure the ultimate success of this important undertaking.

WHEREAS, Columbus County has indefeasible fee simple title of record to those lands shown on plat entitled "Map of a Survey for Columbus County Hospital," dated September 25, 1972, as prepared by Willis & Walker, Registered Surveyors, recorded in Plat Book 15, page 52, Columbus County Registry; reference to which is hereby made for a more complete and accurate description, said property is leased to Columbus County Hospital, Inc. for a term expiring March 6, 1987; and WHEREAS, the voters of Columbus County have approved a Bond Issue in the amount of Six Million Dollars for construction of said hospital; and

WHEREAS, the property hereinabove described has been selected for the construction of said hospital;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED that the above described property is hereby dedicated for the exclusive use of the hospital project as approved by the Division of Facility Services, Department of Human Resources, State of North Carolina, and other such directly related medical programs that may be eligible for State and Federal Grants under the Hospital Survey and Construction (Hill-Burton Act).

Upon motion made by Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner Brown, the following resolution was unanimously passed:
