The Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus, North Carolina, met in regular session at the County Administrative Bldg., in Whiteville, North Carolina, the regular place of meeting, at 10 o'clock A.M., on March 3, 1975.

Present: Chairman Donald P. Currie, presiding, and Commissioners Mayo Brown, Edward W. Williamson, W. B. Buffkin and C. Waldo Marlowe.

Absent: None

The Chairman announced that this was the hour and day fixed by the Board of Commissioners for the public hearing upon the order entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$124,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS" and that the Board would immediately hear anyone who might wish to be heard on the question of the validity of said order or the advisability of issuing said bonds.

No one appeared, either in person, or by attorney, to be heard on the question of the validity of said order or the advisability of issuing said bonds and the County

Accountant and ex officio Clerk announced that no written statement relating to said questions had been received.

Thereupon, upon motion of Commissioner C. Waldo Marlowe seconded by Commissioner Edward W. Williamson and carried, the order introduced and passed on first reading on February 17, 1975 entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$124,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS" was read a second time and placed upon its final passage. The vote upon the final passage of said order was:

Ayes: Commissioners Donald P. Currie, Mayo Brown, Edward W. Williamson, W. B. Buffkin and C. Waldo Marlowe.

Noes: None.

The Chairman then announced that the order entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$124,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS" had been adopted.

The County Accountant and ex officio Clerk was thereupon directed to publish said order, together with the appended statement as required by The Local Government Bond Act, as amended, once in <a href="Mews Reporter">The News Reporter</a>.

Ordered: that the minutes of the meetings of February 3rd and February 17th be approved as recorded.

Ordered: that the Chairman and Accountant be authorized to make line item budget changes within a Department without changing the total amount of the Department Budget.

Ordered: that the salaries for the four deputies in the Sheriff's Dept. be increased from \$650. per month to \$715. beginning with the March payroll period.

Ordered: that the meeting dates for the Board of Equalization and Review be set at April 1, 2, 8, and 9 beginning at 10:00 a.m. each day. It is further ordered that a notice be placed in The News Reporter as required by the General Statutes.

Ordered: that a depreciation allowance of 5% be allowed to industries on machinery in listing personal property for tax purposes.

Ordered: that Betty Beck be given a check for \$50.00 from the Out-Door-Poor

Fund.

Ordered: that the Bi-Centennial Committee be allowed \$200. for operating expenses to be paid out of the Contingency Fund.

Ordered: that the following tax releases be made upon the recommendation of the Tax Supervisor:

That the taxes listed in the name of Vernon Gurganus, Williams Township, be released in the amount of \$24,39 for the year 1974 due to a clerical error in computing.

That the taxes listed in the name of Clifford B & Millie L. Casperson, Chadbourn Township, be released in the amount of \$12.74 for the year 1974 due to double listing.

That the taxes listed in the name of Judith A. Simmons, Chadbourn Township, be cancelled in the amount of \$25.99 for the year 1974 due to double listing in Williams Township.

The following Resolution was brought before the County Commissioners of Columbus County convened in regular session and after discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Buffkin, seconded by Commissioner Brown and unanimously passed;

WHEREAS, criteria for consideration of portions of Columbus County for an Environmental Protection Agency grant for assistance in cost of planning and construction of wastewater is based upon development of a Facilities Plan for the area designated by the North Carolina Department of Natural and Economic Resources, Division of Environmental Management as Facilities Planning Area and in which case a portion of Columbus County is designated to be in the Facilities Planning Area with City of Whiteville; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to designate one of the governmental agencies involved in the area to be the Lead Applicant; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County consider that City of Whiteville is the logical Lead Applicant;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County of Columbus does hereby appoint City of Whiteville as the Lead Applicant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chaiman of the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, be and he is hereby designated as the official County representative for matters concerning wastewater planning and that he is hereby instructed to secure and prepare such documentation as may be necessary to provide the Lead Applicant with the data necessary to adequately perform Wastewater Facilities Planning.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any action requiring funding on the part of Columbus

County shall be brought before the Board of Commissioners for proper appropriation of funds prior

to authorization of such expenditures.

Ordered: that the following named be added to the Bi-Centennial Committee for ...

Columbus County: Francis Jones, Edna Creech, Mrs. R. N. McCray, William Thompson, Estelle Fletcher,

Ben Wilson, Amanda Bible, Patricia Jacobs.

Becky Bunn, State Mental Health Dept.; Dr. Eugene Douglas, Area Director; Elizabeth Covington, Associate Director; and John McKee, Area Administrator met with the Board to discuss and answer questions concerning the services and programs available through the Mental Health Department.

Representatives of the Oratorio Society met with the Board and requested \$2,500. from County funds in the 1975-76 Budget to match State Grants for an art planning program (Music) in Columbus County. No decision was made at this time.

Mr. Dennis Patrick with the Department of Indian Affairs met with the Board to make them aware of some problems of concern to his Department such as roadside litter, jobs for unemployed, Friar Swamp Project and who to contact when a problem arises.

A group of concerned citizens who live on SR1113 met with the Board to ask assistance in getting said road paved. The Board directed them to State Department Officials as this decision does not come under the authority of the Board of Commissioners of the County.

Representative Richard Wright gave the Board a review of his activities concerning local legislation in the State Legislature. He suggested that the Board consider the possibility of requesting a county-wide Referendum on the question of the type of law enforcement for the County. He also brought to their attention other issues that should be considered related to such a referendum. No resolution was offered at this time. Mrs. Peggy Walton and Frances Wheeler also attended this meeting as representatives of the Concerned Citizens Committee.
