The meeting was called to order and the invocation was given by The Reverend John Walkup, Pastor, Westminster Presbyterian Church, Whiteville, N. C.

The following business was transacted:

The minutes of the May 19th were approved as recorded.

Commissioner Williamson introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$120,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BOND  
ANTICIPATION NOTES

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby find and declare:

(a) That an order authorizing \$124,000 County Hospital Bonds was adopted by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus on March 3, 1975, which order has taken effect.

(b) That the amount of bonds authorized by said order was reduced to \$122,000 by an order adopted by said Board of Commissioners on May 5, 1975.

(c) That the proceeds of said bonds are to be used, with the proceeds of \$6,000,000 County Hospital Bonds which were approved at the special bond referendum held on October 6, 1973 and any other available funds, for erecting and equipping a new County hospital in said County, including the acquisition of any necessary rights of way.

(d) That none of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975, has been issued and that no notes have been issued in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975.

(e) That it is necessary to issue at this time \$120,000 notes in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of a like amount of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975.

Section 2. In anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of a like amount of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975, the issuance of \$120,000 negotiable notes of the County of Columbus is hereby authorized, which notes shall be designated "County Hospital Bond Anticipation Notes", shall be dated June 23, 1975, shall mature on July 9, 1975, without option of prior payment, and shall bear interest at a rate to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the notes are sold, which interest shall

be payable at the maturity of the notes to which no interest coupons shall be attached. Said notes shall be payable as to both principal and interest at such bank or trust company, shall have such denomination or denominations and shall bear such number or numbers as may be fixed by the Chairman after the award of the notes by the Local Government Commission, and both the principal of and the interest on said notes shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, at the time of payment, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 3. Said notes shall be signed by the Chairman and the County Accountant and ex officio Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and the official seal of said Board shall be affixed to said notes. The form of said notes and the endorsement to be placed upon the reverse thereof shall be substantially as follows:

Thereupon Commissioner Buffkin introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,120,000 COUNTY HOSPITAL BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby find and declare:

(a) That an order authorizing \$6,000,000 County Hospital Bonds was adopted by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus on August 20, 1973, which order was approved by the vote of a majority of the qualified voters of said County who voted thereon at a referendum duly called and held on October 6, 1973.

(b) That none of said bonds has been issued and that no notes have been issued in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds.

(c) That it is necessary to issue at this time all of said bonds.

(d) That an order authorizing \$124,000 County Hospital Bonds was adopted by said Board of Commissioners on March 3, 1975, which order has taken effect.

(e) That the amount of bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975 was reduced to \$122,000 by an order adopted by said Board of Commissioners on May 5, 1975.

(f) That the proceeds of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3,

1975 are to be used, with the proceeds of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on August 20, 1973 and any other available funds, for erecting and equipping a new County hospital in said County, including the acquisition of any <sup>necessary</sup> rights of way.

(g) That none of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975 has been issued and that there will be outstanding \$120,000 County Hospital Bond Anticipation Notes of the County of Columbus, dated June 23, 1975 and maturing July 9, 1975, which will be issued in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds of the sale of a like amount of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975.

(h) That it is necessary to issue at this time \$120,000 of said bonds authorized by said order adopted on March 3, 1975, all of the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of said County Hospital Bond Anticipation Notes at their maturity.

(i) That it is convenient to consolidate for the purpose of their issuance said \$6,000,000 County Hospital Bonds and said \$120,000 County Hospital Bonds into a single issue of \$6,120,000 County Hospital Bonds.

(j) That the maximum <sup>period</sup> of usefulness of the new County hospital to be erected and equipped pursuant to said orders adopted on August 20, 1973 and March 3, 1975 is estimated as a period of forty years from June 1, 1975, the date of said \$6,120,000 County Hospital Bonds as provided in Section 2 of this resolution, and that such period expires on June 1, 1975.

Section 2. For the purpose provided in said orders adopted on August 20, 1973 and March 3, 1975, there shall be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the County of Columbus in the aggregate principal amount of \$6,120,000, designated "County Hospital Bonds", dated June 1, 1975 and consisting of 1,224 bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 each, numbered 1 to 1,224, inclusive. Said bonds shall mature annually, June 1, in numerical order, lowest numbers first, \$195,000. 1978, \$200,000. 1979 to 1981, inclusive \$225,000. 1982 to 1984, inclusive, \$250,000. 1985, \$275,000. 1986, \$300,000. 1987, \$325,000. 1988, \$400,000. 1989, \$425,000. 1990 to 1996, inclusive, and \$125,000. 1997, without option of prior payment, and bear interest from their date at a rate or rates to be determined by the Local Government Commission at the time the bonds are sold, which interest to the maturity thereof shall be payable semi-annually on the 1st days of June and December of each year, and both the principal and the interest on said bonds shall be payable at Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company, in the Borough of Manhattan, City & State of New York, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, at the respective dates of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be executed with the facsimile signatures of the Chairman and the County Accountant and ex officio Clerk of the Board of Commissioners, and a facsimile of the official seal of said Board shall be imprinted on said bonds, and the interest coupons to be attached to said bonds shall be executed with the facsimile signature of said County Accountant and ex officio Clerk. It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to happen, exist and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this bond by the Constitution and laws of North Carolina have happened, exist and have been performed in regular and due form and time as so required; that provision has been made for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax upon all taxable property within the said County sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on this bond as the same shall become due; and that the total indebtedness of said County, including this bond, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation thereon.

This bond may be registered as to principal only in accordance with the provisions endorsed hereon.

Ordered: that a refund check be given to Carl F. Butler, Lees Township, for being charged penalty for late listing in error. Refund is to be \$6.09.

Ordered: that the late listing penalty in the name of Rozier and Ruby Blackwell, Chadbourn Township be released for the years 1970 through 1974.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby request that the Department of Transportation pave the driveway for the Evergreen Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department from their building to the highway.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners endorse and support the bill entitled AN ACT AUTHROIZING UNITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO ISSUE GRANT ANTICIPATION NOTES FOR CAPITAL PRO-JECTS IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPT OF MONEYS FROM GRANT COMMITMENTS FOR SUCH CAPITAL PROJECTS FROM THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA OR THE UNITED STATES OF ANY AGENCIES OF EITHER. This bill was introduced by Representative Swartz at the request of Harlam Boyles, Secretary, Local Govern-ment Commission.

The Finance Officer presented the Budget Estimate to the Board for the FY 1975-76 for their consideration and filed a copy with the Clerk to the Board for public inspection. Also, an advertisement was placed in The News Reporter announcing a public hearing to be held in the Courthouse, Whiteville, at 8:00 p.m., June 12th.

Mr. Cameron West, Personnel Analyst, met with the Board to further discuss the Personnel Administration Plan proposed for Columbus County Employees. Mr. West was instructed to make changes in the proposal to limit the number of days of vacation to 15 per year for employees who have been working with the County 5 years or more. Other instructions were to allow present employees who would be affected by the retirement age of 65 to continue to work until June 30, 1976, or if they reach age 65 in FY 1975-76 they may remain until same said date. It will be mandatory for all other employees to retire at the end of the month that they be-come 65 except the Tax Collector and Finance Officer who may remain until the end of the FY.

Ordered: that Chapters Eight through Thirteen of the Personnel Administration Plan be adopted as of this date which deals with affirmative action policy and grevience procedures. All other sections will become effective on July 1, 1975.
