The following business was transacted:

A motion was made by Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner Marlowe and unanimously passed to hire Garland D. McCullen as County Extension Chairman.

A motion was made by Commissioner Williamson, seconded by Commissioner Marlowe and unanimously passed to adopt the COLUMBUS COUNTY CIVIL PREPARDNESS OPERATIONAL PLAN AND RESCUE MANUAL as the plan for Civil Prepardness operation in Columbus County.

RESOLUTIONOF THE COMMISSIONERS ALLOWING THEM TO CONDUCT A LOW-INCOME HOUSING PROGRAM AND TO CONTRACT WITH A SECOND PARTY TO CARRY OUT ALL REQUIRED OPERATIONS IN COUNTY

WHEREAS, it is the expressed intent of the Columbus County Board of Commissioners to see that all citizens in their county are provided with ample, above standard living space; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's Section 8 Rental Assistance Payments Program will be available to the County of Columbus Board of Commissioners upon their approval of application; and

WHEREAS, implementation of said program will improve the quality of housing available to low to moderate income citizens of Columbus County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Columbus County Board of Commissioners will make application for funds available under the Section 8 Rental Assistance Payments Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize itself to engage in the operation of a low-income housing program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize itself to contract with a second party to engage in all operations of the Section 8 Rental Assistance Payments Program.

The foregoing Resolution was unanimously adopted uopn motion by Commissioner Williamson and seconded by Commissioner Buffkin.

Ordered: that the Public Safety Commission be designated as the agency to dispose of the County Police autos which have been replaced this year.

Ordered: that the Sheriff be designated as the agency to dispose of the Sheriff's Department's autos which have been replaced this year.

Ordered: that the Accountant pay Mrs. Bible for the time she was away on leave of absence during June and July.

Ordered: that the Clerk inform Rhone Anderson that no expenses are to be incurred on the used dragline purchased from federal surplus until approved by the Board.

Ordered: that the Clerk write a letter to the Congressman and Senators from this district supporting securing federal crop insurance on corn and soy beans at such time as requested by Mr. H. J. Watts who is presently securing signatures on a partition supporting same.

Tax Supervisor, Mr. Brooks Stanley, presented the late tax listings for September to the Board.

Mr. Paul Sutton, Lake Waccamaw, met with the Board and requested that a portion of the 5¢ ABC tax be contributed to the Good Shepherd Home at Lake Waccamaw to rehibilitate alcoholics. The Board instructed the County Attorney to get a determination from the Attorney General if this would be a permissable expenditure before a decision can be made by the Board.
