The Chairman announced that it was the advertised time to open bids for the purchase of autos for the Sheriff's Department. The following bid was the only one received:

The bid was accepted to purchase the autos after July 1, 1976.

Ordered: that the Finance Officer prepare the 1976-77 Budget Estimate on a base valuation of \$330,000,000. at a collection rate of 88%. The Tax Supervisor reported an increase in the valuation of \$12,000,000. according to the figures compiled by his office and recommended the budget be based on the above figure.

RESOLUTION DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF INTENTION OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO CREATE AN INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES AND POLLUTION CONTROL FINANCING AUTHORITY IN COLUMBUS COUNTY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby declare that the Board of Commissioners has determined to create by resolution a political subdivision and a body corporate and politic of the State of North Carolina to be known as "The Columbus County Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control Financing Authority" (the "Authority) pursuant to the provisions of Article V, Section 9 of the Constitution of North Carolina and Chapter 159C of the General Statutes of North Carolina (the "Act").

Section 2. In compliance with Section 159C-4(a) of the Act, the Board of Commissioners hereby directs the Clerk to file with the Department of Natural and Economic Resources of the State of North Carolina and the Local Government Commission of the State of North Carolina

notice of its intention to adopt a resolution creating the Authority, which notice shall be in the form attached hereto as EXHIBIT A.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect upon its passage.

Ordered: that a release be made to Glenwood and Sylvia Robinson, Chadbourn Town-ship, for the year 1974, on the valuation of \$1,000. due to double listing.

Ordered: that the receipt be returned to the Federal Land Bank for the taxes of Andrew J. Smith. Mr. Smith appeared before the Board of Equalization & Review concerning his property valuation but any decision by the Board would not reduce his 1975 tax liability.

The report of tax collections for the month of April was presented to the Board for their information.

Mrs. Betty Timberlake, Bicenntenial Chairman of Lake Waccamaw, graciously invited the Board to attend the Bicenntenial Celebration for Columbus County on July 4th at Lake Waccamaw She gave a presentation of the planned program which is very interesting.
