Deputy Sasser stated that the Sheriff could organize his Department as he sees fit to best serve the public and he feels the present set-up is the best service to the public. He also stated that they would go back to a detective division under the Sheriff's Department when they have qualified and dedicated personnel.

There were approximately 20 persons present, including the press, who were given a chance to be heard on the matter.

In finality, the Sheriff indicated that he would set up a detective division in the future but no definite time was quoted.

Upon motion the meeting adjourned until February 5, 1979, at 10:00 a.m.

About ten interested wildlife hunters met with the Board and presented petitions protesting the adoption of the Resolution passed by the Board in the October 2nd meeting which requested that local legislation be passed to close bear season in Columbus County.

After a discussion of the matter between the hunters, Denton Baumbarger, Wild-life Biologist, and the Board, a motion was made by Commissioner Hinson, seconded by Commissioner Williamson and passed to rescind the Resolution of October 2nd and leave the decision on bear hunting season for Columbus County up to the wildlife personnel. It was further ordered that a notice be sent to the respective Legislators who have been sent the original Resolution and request that they not introduce local legislation for the County on this matter.

The following tax releases were approved upon the recommendation of the Tax Supervisor/ Tax Collector and upon motion by Commissioner Williamson and seconded by Commissioner Hinson:
