Jerry Pridgen, representing J & J Developers, proposed to construct a 32,000 square foot office building that could house the Department of Social Services that could be constructed and ready by August 1, 1993, on a five-acre tract site directly behind the existing Social Services facility. Mr. Pridgen stated that J & J would lease the building to the county for \$342,000 a year, with the payment amount tied to movement in U.S. Treasury bill interest rates after five years. The county would own the building after leasing for 20 years for the sum of \$1.00.

After the new facility is occupied, the old Social Services Building will be demolished and used for a parking lot.

A motion was made by Commissioner Richardson to accept the proposal from J & J Developers, Inc. with the stipulation that the County Auditing firm, W.A. Wayne, CPA, is to check in to the legality of the bidding process for local governments.

Commissioner Richardson's motion died in lack of a second.

A motion was made by Commissioner Richardson, seconded by Commissioner Norris and passed to allow W.A. Wayne, CPA, to review the J & J Developers lease proposal and report to the Board on what reimbursements the County would receive on leasing a facility compared to purchasing a facility.
